EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

As a result of a request by Messrs TKL Architects, acting on behalf of Peter Symonds College, a proposal to revise the existing waiting restrictions in Bereweeke Way, Winchester is considered necessary to accommodate the potential development of land adjacent to 20 Bereweeke Way. To facilitate the potential development the existing on-street residents permit holder parking bays will have to be relocated to prevent probable future obstruction.

The relevant County Councillor, City Councillors, Police and Parking Office Manager were consulted and gave their approval to proceed with the proposal. Public notices were placed in the Hampshire Chronicle on Thursday 1st February 2007, and erected on street from Thursday 1st February 2007 up to and including Monday 26th February 2007. 21 letters of objection to the proposal have been received as a result of these notices.

The objections mainly state that any change to the existing restrictions will be detrimental to their amenity, could result in the removal of a hedgerow, will reduce the available on-street parking and may result in road safety hazard. A summary of all objection letters is attached.

The grounds stated on the letters are not considered sufficient for the proposal to be withdrawn on traffic management or roads safety grounds. The revised on-street parking facilities will be sufficient and the relocated bay will not result in any visibility problems for road users at this location.

The impact of the potential development on visual amenity and the possible loss of the hedgerow will be the subject of the planning application process and are not considered relevant to the traffic regulation order being considered in this report.

It should be noted that the outcome of this traffic regulation order proposal shall in no way have any influence on the planning application process. If the traffic regulation order proposal is approved for implementation the revised waiting restrictions will only be implemented if the planning permission is granted. If the planning application is unsuccessful the revised traffic regulation order, even if it is approved, will not be implemented.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- That the proposed revision to the Traffic Regulation Order in Bereweeke Way, Winchester be approved such that the existing 'Permit Holders Only 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday' waiting restrictions be replaced with 'No Waiting 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday' and a new length of 'Permit Holders Only 8am to 6pm Monday to Saturday' waiting restrictions be introduced as advertised and the Head of Legal Services be authorised to make the necessary order.
- 2. That the proposed revision to the Traffic Regulation Order be implemented in the event of the associated planning application being granted approval.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

CORPORATE STRATEGY (RELEVANCE TO):

This proposal relates to the priorities of "High Quality Environment" and "Safe and Strong Communities" in the Corporate Strategy in its attempt to improve traffic management and road safety should the associated housing development receive planning permission.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

The cost of implementing this proposal is being fully funded by the developer.

There will be no additional enforcement costs as a result of this proposal.



Summary of Correspondents from Informal Consultation

Dr F J and Mrs D M Whitbread	11 Bereweeke Way	Peter Symond's students have led to significant parking problems. Present parking arrangement is working for residents. Proposed location would move to a more dangerous position adjacent to a bend, where line of sight is crucial to safety. Residents parking would reduce by a third – Inadequate!
AP Baker	14 Bereweeke Way	Reducing parking bay size will not improve amenities for anyone using the facilities. Safety considerations as proposed parking will be near a bend.
David and Clare Campbell	17 Bereweeke Way	Reduction in size would NOT 'preserve and improve the amenities' and would NOT 'provide suitable and adequate parking facilities'.
