CAB1397(TP) - Proposed Experimental TRO, The Square, Winchester - 30 January 2007.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Further to representations from traders in The Square, Winchester and through meetings with The Square Traders Group, the Winchester Chamber of Commerce, the City Centre Manager and Council officers a semi-pedestrian area of The Square was agreed.

An experimental traffic regulation order prohibiting vehicles in The Square, Winchester (service spur) from 11:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Saturday between a point 8.6 metres north its junction with The Square (main section) and a point 22.2 metres north of that junction was approved.

This order was implemented and the restrictions introduced on 15 March 2007. Since this time the order has proven to be effective and has received no comments or objections other than requests for the hours of the prohibition to be extended. Under the experimental order currently in place it is not possible to extend the hours as part of this review process, it is therefore proposed to make the restrictions as advertised permanent and for further investigations to be carried out with regards to extending the times of the restrictions.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. That work be carried out for the waiting restrictions covered in the experimental traffic regulation order for The Square, Winchester to be made permanent.
- 2. That the Head of Legal Services be authorised to make a permanent order as set out in Recommendation 1.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

The proposal is in keeping with the Corporate Strategy in its attempt to provide a high quality environment & safe and strong communities.



IMPLEMENTATION: The Order will come into effect on 15th March 2007.

The Order is to be on an experimental basis for a maximum period of 18 months and the Council will, in due course consider whether the provisions of the Order should continue in force indefinitely.

<u>OBJECTIONS:</u> Within a period of six months from when the experimental Order comes into force or, if the Order is subsequently varied or modified within six months of the date of the coming into force of such variation or modification any person may object to the making of an order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation.

The Order is to be on an experimental basis for a maximum period of 18 months and the Council will, in due course consider whether the provisions of the Order should continue in force indefinitely.

<u>OBJECTIONS:</u> Within a period of six months from when the experimental Order comes into force or, if the Order is subsequently varied or modified within six months of the date of the coming into force of such variation or modification any person may object to the making of an order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation.
