It is not practical to list individual comments due to the volume of responses, however, the vast majority of respondents wanting the experimental order stopped and the traffic flows returned stated their reasons for this being the extra time and mileage caused by having to travel around the main one-way system.

They also stated that they believed this to be causing extra congestion and pollution and that it often resulted in more stress as they had to sit in traffic queues for longer than before.

Those in favour of the experiment being made permanent expressed views that the environmental benefits in Parchment Street and Middle Brook Street outweighed the negative impact of motorists travelling through the town centre, even if the change had caused them some inconvenience.
