CAPITAL OUTTURN 2005/06

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This report provides an overview of actual expenditure for 2005/06 against the capital programme. The report includes the original capital programme budget and revisions to the programme approved by Cabinet during the course of the year. Explanations of any significant variations in expenditure are also given and a request for carry forward of funding is made.

Total expenditure on the capital programme was £7.98m, a shortfall of £1.55m against the original budget and £2.09m against the revised budget. Carry forward requests amount to £1.68m.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That it be recommended to Council to approve the carry forward of capital funds totalling £1.68m from 2005/06 to 2006/07, in accordance with Financial Procedure Rule 7.8.

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1 <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 This report provides an overview of the actual expenditure on the capital programme for 2005/06 and gives comment on any significant variations.
- 1.2 For discreet capital projects and defined programmes the project budget and prior year spend is included to give a more comprehensive picture.

2 Summary

- 2.1 Overall the outturn position at 31 March 2006 compared with the expected position was as follows:
 - ➤ total expenditure on the capital programme was £7.98m, a shortfall of £1.55m against the original budget and £2.09m against the revised budget;
 - > Carry forward requests amount to £1.68m.

3 Variances

- 3.1 Notes on outturn variances are shown in the appendix to this report.
- 3.2 Requests for funding to be carried forward into 2006/07 include the following items:
 - a) Sewage Treatment Works £217,000 a programme for future works has been considered by Cabinet and carry forward agreed (CAB1226),
 - b) Capital grants for Community Development £31,000 where grants have been committed but not yet paid out,
 - c) Guildhall improvements £18,000 minor capital works to the Guildhall,
 - d) Swanmore Community scheme £303,000 project is complete and balance of grant will be paid on signing of SLA,
 - e) Denmead environmental improvements £62,000 balance of committed funds will be paid in 2006/07,
 - f) Waterways improvements £59,000 programme of works will be brought to Cabinet before any further expenditure is incurred,
 - g) Groundworks in Jewry Street £180,000 contribution to filling in air-raid shelters on Cultural Centre site,
 - h) E-government programme £550,000 ongoing work to meet e-government targets,
 - i) Avalon House £50,000 capital maintenance to electrical/mechanical equipment,
 - j) Guildhall £33,000 operational property repairs,

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k) River Park Leisure Centre £177,000 – major upgrade work started in March 2006 and due to be finished by end of June

3.3 If approved, in accordance with Financial Procedure Rules 7.7 and 7.8, the requests to carry forward a total of £1.68m will increase the 2006/07 capital programme budget by that amount. In accordance with Financial Procedure Rule 7.8 this requires the approval of Council.
