647. PETITIONS UNDER COUNCIL PROCEDURE RULE 15

The Mayor informed the Council that there were two petitions to be presented.

Mr B Schofield presented a petition submitted by local residents which sought the removal of Little Frenchies Field, Denmead from the list of Local Reserve Sites in the Proposed Modifications to the Winchester District Local Plan, which had been recommended by the Winchester District Local Plan Inspector.

Mr G Blackman presented a petition submitted by the Save Barton Farm Group, which sought the deletion of the Barton Farm site as a reserve Major Development Area from the Proposed Modifications to the Winchester District Local Plan.

Both petitioners spoke in support of their respective requests, following which the Mayor thanked them for their submissions and explained that their comments would be taken into account during consideration of Recommended Minutes 588, 589, 590 and 591, later in the meeting.

Winchester District Local Plan Inspectors Report - 'Local Reserve' Sites (Recommended Minute 588)

The Portfolio Holder for Planning, Councillor Beveridge, moved that in the interests of clarity and in an attempt to ensure that items were as comprehensible as possible to Members and the public, the wording in the Recommendation to Minute 588 be deleted and replaced with the following:

"RECOMMENDED

1. That the Council recognises that through the well established, well publicised and well exercised process of the Public Inquiry into objections to the Winchester District Local Plan, consideration was given to all sites proposed for development by landowners and developers.

2. That the Council understands the Inspectors' precautionary principle of identifying four sites as being appropriate for designation as reserve sites for development, should this be required to meet the Council's housing delivery obligations, subject to all the usual planning considerations.

3. That Council welcomes the ability to decide for itself, in consultation with local people, how to manage development by taking full account of the nature of windfall and other sites when determining the appropriate density of housing development, knowing that it has a reserve of suitable land to draw upon to meet its overall obligations.

4. That the Council will adopt a rigorous programme of 'plan, monitor, manage' of our housing delivery to accord with the targets set by Regional Planning Guidance, releasing any of the local reserve sites only when we consider their release is necessary to meet those targets.

5. That the Council therefore welcomes the ability to protect Pitt Manor; Francis Gardens/ Worthy Road, Winchester; Spring Gardens, Alresford and Little Frenchies Field, Denmead, from immediate development by their proposed designation as local reserve sites in the Winchester District Local Plan, and welcomes the confirmation that nearly 200 other sites promoted by developers should not be allocated for development."

The above wording was seconded by Councillor Campbell and became the revised Original Motion to be determined by Council.

Amendment (1) Councillor Davies (2) Councillor Rees

"Delete all words after 'RECOMMENDED' and insert:-

That the Council resolves to delete all references in the Proposed 1. Modifications documents to the four 'Local Reserve Sites' and authorises the officers to make appropriate changes to the draft documents, to enable their publication to take place for public consultation according to the recommended timetable.

2. That the Council rejects the Inspectors' recommendations on this aspect of their report, as they give no sound and clear reasons how releasing all or any of these sites would provide appropriate new housing to replace any delay or deficiency in the timetable for new housing already allocated in other parts of the District, particularly at the Waterlooville Major Development Area in the period up to 2011; and in the case of the Pitt Manor site, this Council believes that the Inspectors failed to give due weight to the planning history of the site; failed to take full account of the identification of the site as "principal open/green area within the City and its setting" in the document "Winchester City and its Setting"; confused policies for Park and Ride on the southern radial routes into the City; and ignored the evidence from the Hampshire County Council, as Highway Authority, that conditions in Romsey Road were a severe impediment to development, that road widening could not overcome capacity at nearby junctions and such development would seriously exacerbate the existing congestion."

In accordance with Council Procedure Rule 32(1), one quarter of the Members present and voting required that a recorded vote be taken in respect of the amendment.
