#### 828. COMMUNICATION FROM THE MAYOR

The Mayor reported with pleasure that the City Council, through its Health at Work Group, had been awarded first place in the Large Employer category of the BBC's 'Big Challenge' Health Award. Two representatives of the Group were presented with the award 'on air' during the Nick Gurdler Show on Radio Solent. The Council congratulated all those involved with the initiative.

#### 829. COMMUNICATION FROM THE LEADER

The Leader of the Council reported that, earlier in the week, the planning appeal by Cala Homes regarding major development at Barton Farm, Winchester, was dismissed by the Secretary of State, on the recommendation of the appeal Inspector. However, the appeal decision did refer to the high levels of housing need in the District, which that development would have eased to some extent. Therefore, whilst there would be no development of Barton Farm at this stage, both the Council and local residents needed to be mindful of the future pressures which would no doubt arise.

The Leader then referred to the Local Authority Business Grant Incentive Scheme (LABGI), where the City Council had been awarded a one-off amount of £408,000, to take account of the increase in rateable value in the District.

## 831. PETITION UNDER COUNCIL PROCEDURE RULE 15

The Mayor informed the Council that there was one petition to be presented.

Mrs C St Leger Davey presented a petition submitted by local residents which requested the Council to support the Telecommunications (Planning Control) Bill, which proposed that telecommunications mast applications be placed under greater local authority control, and that the issues to be taken into account when determining such applications be widened.

Mrs St Leger Davey spoke in support of her request, following which the Mayor thanked her for her submission and explained that her comments would be taken into account later in the meeting, when the Council considered a Notice of Motion by Councillor Bennetts which related to the same matter.

Points 1 and 3 of the amendment were lost. Points 2 and 4 were agreed after the Proposer and Seconder accepted additional wording to make the amendments read as follows:

- "2 Increase feelings of safety by reducing the likelihood that people will indulge in anti-social behaviour, and to continue to collaborate with our partners and continue to drive down levels of crime generally.
- 4 Make sustainable use of resources, with special attention to reducing and recycling waste."

"That under the category Homes and Jobs, the first bullet point be amended to read:

Provide housing, in particular affordable housing, to meet the needs of the whole community."

## Budget and Council Tax 2006/07 (Recommended Minute 789)

The Portfolio Holder for Finance and Resources, Councillor Learney, moved that Recommended Minute 789 be approved and adopted, subject to the inclusion of the following additional recommendation (which was seconded by Councillor Campbell and became the Revised Original Motion before Council):-

"11. That the proposals for the use of the one-off LABGI scheme grant funding totalling £405,000 be approved subject to the conditions set out below:

## (a) £120,000 Economic Development Action Plan Funding

Possible areas for consideration are:

- promotion of a Business Improvement District (BID) in Winchester City Centre including temporary cover for the City Centre Manager and revenues software requirements
- starting work on a potential BID for the Whiteley area
- partnership work with the County and Whiteley Business Forum to reduce Whiteley business parking and travel problems in a sustainable way
- promotion of local produce

- redundant buildings project, assist with repair or renovations to buildings in the market towns and rural areas such as Alresford, Bishops Waltham and Denmead and promotion of these as business locations
- Winnall regeneration

Detailed proposals will be brought to Cabinet for approval.

(b) £60,000 Town Centres Wardens Pilot

Following consultation with businesses, to enable a one year pilot scheme for the introduction of wardens to Winchester City Centre and for regular visits to other centres in the District such as Alresford and Bishops Waltham. Roles for wardens are likely to include: providing a visible presence in the town centres, answering questions from visitors, reporting problems and dealing with environmental problems. This will pave the way for potential future funding from other sources including the Winchester BID and Town and Parish Councils.

Detailed proposals will be brought to Cabinet and Personnel Committee for approval.

(c) £35,000 Winchester in Bloom

One year funding to pay for this year's displays and to give time to consider putting the Winchester organisation on a similar footing to other In Bloom organisations around the Country.

Approval delegated to the Director of Communities in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Economy and Transport.

- (d) £20,000 Improved Signage Project
  - Funding for the removal of surplus signs and signposts which reduce the attraction of the District
  - Additional finger posts directing visitors to off High Street shopping areas and other facilities

Approval delegated to the Director of Development in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Economy and Transport.

(e) £50,000 Management and Display of Heritage Collections

Rationalisation and move of collections supporting the Jewry Street Cultural Quarter concept.

Detailed proposals will be brought to Cabinet for approval.

(f) £120,000 Planning Improvement Plan

Two year funding for additional staff to work on the major planning applications, helping to bring forward mixed developments such as West of Waterlooville and Silver Hill (and possibly generating more LABGI and Planning Delivery Grant money).

Approval delegated to the Director of Development in consultation with the Director of Human Resources and the Chairman of Personnel Committee."

However, following debate, the Proposer and Seconder agreed revised wording so that the additional recommendation would now read as follows:-

"11. That the proposals for the use of the one-off LABGI Scheme grant funding be approved, subject to the conditions set out below:-

(a) £35,000 Winchester in Bloom

One year funding to pay for this year's displays and to give time to consider putting the Winchester organisation on a similar footing to other In Bloom organisations around the Country.

Approval delegated to the Director of Communities in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Economy and Transport.

(b) Remaining £370,000

That proposals be brought forward to Cabinet for approval and implementation, subject to consultation with Principal Scrutiny Committee and, in the event of any disagreement, those aspects of the proposals be referred back to Council for determination."

- (a) Magdalen Hill and West Hill Cemeteries;
- (b) Allotments;
- (c) Town centre Christmas lighting;
- (d) Footway lighting;

(e) Bus shelter maintenance;

(f) Grants for community facilities in the Town ("parish" element);

- (g) Parks and playing fields (except Abbey Gardens, Riverside Walks, the Weirs Gardens and St Giles Hill);
- (h) Community Wardens;
- (i) Neighbourhood Design Statements;
- (j) Arboricultural work;
- (k) St Faith's Meadow;
- (I) Administration of the Town Forum.

2. That it be noted that at its meeting on 11 January 2006 the Council calculated the following amounts for the year 2006/07 in accordance with Regulations made under Section 33(5) of the Local Government Finance Act 1992:-

(a) £46,207.85, being the amount calculated by the Council, in accordance with Regulation 3 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base) Regulations 1992, as its Council Tax base for the year.
