EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

At its meeting held on 21 February 2013, Council debated the Cabinet's recommended Change Plans. These Plans are intended to set out what progress the Administration plans to make in the coming period to realise the Community's aspirations, as set out in the Sustainable Community Strategy.

Council debated amended wording to the first part of those Change Plans which, under the heading "What's Important to Us", seeks to explain what the Administration considers to be the principle focus for change under each of the four priority areas for action. They resolved:

"That the Leader of the Council and the Leader of the Opposition meet to agree revised wording to that section of the Change Plans setting out "What is Important to Us" and that the revised text be submitted to the special meeting of the Council to be held on 20 March for confirmation"

The appendix to this Report sets out revised text which reflects discussion between Cllrs Wood, Learney and Pines. It is submitted to Council for approval.
