Budget and Council Tax 2015/16

Councillor Godfrey drew Members' attention to a revision to the Recommended Minute of Cabinet which had been circulated to the meeting. This set out a technical adjustment in some of the figures in order to meet the requirements of the council tax freeze funding scheme.

The Winchester Town precept had been reduced from £61.32 to £61.19 in order to meet the council tax freeze funding scheme requirement of either freezing or reducing the 'basic amount of Council Tax'. In order to freeze the total tax at £143.65 it was necessary to actually reduce the Winchester Town precept because the Winchester Town tax base was growing at a higher rate than the district as a whole. The reduction in Council Tax collection of £1,715 was to be funded through a reduced transfer to the Major Investment Reserve.
