1. Application

Applicant: David Nicholson

Premises: The Kings Arms, 88 Chesil Street, Winchester

This application is for the variation of a premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. Mr Nicholson has applied to provide regulated entertainment in the form of **recorded music**, **late night refreshment and supply of alcohol to the public until 0200 daily**. He has also applied to include the first floor of the premises to convert the premises into a restaurant.

At present the premises is a pub which allows the public to access the ground floor only, and the premises licence currently only permits the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment during the following hours:-

4. Observations

The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee must have regard to all relevant representations.

The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps it considers necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives:

- 1. Grant the application as per the application, or
- 2. Modify the conditions of the licence by alteration or addition, or
- 3. Reject the whole or part of the application.

Decisions made under 2 or 3 above must actually be necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives.

Terminal hours.

The Sub-Committee should take account of the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy with regard to terminal hours and take such steps as it considers necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives.

(Licensing Policy A8)

Licensing Objectives.

Crime and Disorder

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions to prevent crime and public disorder relating to the premises having regard to the observations of Hampshire Constabulary and the interested parties.

(Licensing Policy 1.6, 2.11, 2.17)

Public Safety

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions relating to public safety having regard to the observations of the Director of Communities and Hampshire Constabulary.

(Licensing Policy B3, B4)

Public Nuisance

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions to prevent public nuisance caused by noise pollution from the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the observations of Hampshire Constabulary and Interested Parties.

(Licensing Policy Section C)

Protection of Children

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions for the Protection of Children having regard to the Operating Schedule.

(Licensing Policy D6, D7)

Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, necessary in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

5. Conditions

Mandatory Conditions

Under the Licensing Act 2003, the following conditions are mandatory on all premises licence. They are included on the existing licence and cannot be removed as a result of this application:-

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Possible Conditions

If the application is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following conditions to reflect the Operating Schedule:

Operating Hours

- 1. The hours the premises may open for other than Licensable Activities shall be:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday 0800 to 0230
- 2. The hours the premises may be used for the sale of alcohol shall be:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday 1000 to 0200
- 3. The hours the premises may be used for regulated entertainment shall be:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday 0800 to 0200

(Indoors and Outdoors of the premises)

- 4. The hours the premises may be used the provision of late night refreshment shall be:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday 2300 to 0200

(Indoors and Outdoors of the premises)

All Licensing Objectives

Crime and Disorder

- 1. The premises shall be a member of a local Pubwatch scheme and agree to purchase a personal Pubwatch radio.
- 2. All staff shall be trained to monitor all trading areas and report any suspicious incidents, criminal activity or disorder.
- A CCTV system shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Police with recording facilities, maintained to an acceptable standard. The recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and be made available upon request by the Police.
- 4. Irresponsible drinks promotions shall not be held.

Public Safety

- 1. At least two SIA registered door staff on duty Friday and Saturday nights from 2000 until close. All door staff shall wear reflective jackets at all times when they are on duty.
- 2. The first floor shall not be used for the purposes of this licence until the means of escape has been protected and upgraded to the satisfaction of the Director of Communities.

Public Nuisance

- 1. Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents, to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 2. All doors and windows shall be closed at Midnight (save for entry and exit to the premises) in order to reduce public nuisance.
- 3. There shall be no entry or re admission permitted after 0100 on any night.
- 4. There shall no deliveries between 1900 and 0630.

Protection of Children

1. The premises shall adopt and implement the Hampshire Constabulary's Challenge 21 Scheme.

Informatives

The following measures are recommended to the Licensee, but are not being suggested as conditions, and would not be enforceable under the Licensing Act. In many cases, however, they may be requirements under other legislation.

- 1. The Licensee is advised to establish the acceptable occupancy for the premises in accordance with fire safety legislation.
- 2. All doors on escape routes should be free from fastenings, or if fitted should only be simple fastenings that can be readily operated from the side approached by people making an escape. The operation of these fastenings should be without the use of a key and without having to manipulate more than one mechanism.
- 3. Periodic inspection certificates should be kept on the premises for the emergency lighting, fire fighting equipment, and fire alarm and detection system.
- 4. Copies of fire test results on any fabrics should be held on the premises for inspection if required.
- 5. If the premises are not fitted with a fire alarm and detection system then a written procedure for raising the alarm should be kept on the premises.





This application has been submitted with insufficient content as to how the four Licensing Objectives will be complied with.

We consider that any Prominent Premises situated on a main artery route and very close to the City Centre with dwellings adjacent and nearby must have suitable control measures in place should later hours be applied for. This application would authorise unrestricted Licensable activities inside and outside along with the supply of alcohol until 0200 7 days a week.

We consider that as a minimum any Licensable Premises that wishes to trade to these hours should have:-

- 1. At least two SIA door staff on duty Friday & Saturday nights from 2000 until close. All door staff to wear reflective jackets.
- 2. A Fully functioning CCTV system must be installed in accordance with the Hampshire Constabulary Crime Prevention advisor. Cameras should cover the entrance/ exit points, dance area and any vulnerable standing areas. All images must be retained for 30 days and made available to Police upon request.
- 3. A wind down / Hours open to the public no longer than 30 minutes after Licensable activities cease.
- 4. No entry or re admission after 0100 on any night.
- 5. Clear signs must be displayed requesting that customers leave quietly and not be a nuisance to nearby residents.
- 6. Adopt the Challenge 21 Scheme.
- 7. Undertake not to provide any irresponsible drinks promotions
- 8. All doors and windows to be closed at Midnight save for entry and exit in order to reduce Public Nuisance.
- 9. Become a member of the local Pubwatch scheme and agree to purchase a personal Pub Watch radio.

Our concerns are based on the fact that this Licence, should it be granted could quite easily mean that the Premises could trade equally as a traditional pub, restaurant or disco. The Licence will also be transferable at any point in the future.

In respect of the application by David Nicholson for a variation of premises license regarding The Kings Arms, 88 Chesil Street, we wish to state the following objections:

- The continuous thump and vibration of music until the early hours of the morning is disturbing to the residents of East Hill. We already know this from previous music sessions held at the Kings Arms. In the summer, with windows open, it is unbearable. Even in the winter, the sound travels.
- 2. Visitors to The Kings Arms will be leaving during the early hours of the morning. The increase in traffic, noise from the car park, and the shouting and slamming of car doors will be trapped in the well of sound created by the tall houses of Chesil Street and the wall of the old railway embankment. Sound in Chesil Street and the East Hill reverberates in a strange way because there is little outlet.
- 3. Visitors who leave The Kings Arms on foot are liable to cause damage to property in East Hill, as we know to our cost. The increase in visitors to the venue will increase the risk by a large percent.

- 4. There is already a high rat population in the area of Chesil Street Car Park and East Hill because of the amount of food thrown around the area. This is likely to increase with the application to serve 'late night refreshments' as per Mr Nicholson's application. Waste bins in Chesil Street Car Park are overflowing 2 days after being emptied in the summer. The rats live in the railway embankment and are regularly seen in the Car Park, and along the banks of East Hill, even in daylight hours.
- 5. Due to late-night opening hours of The Kings Arms, Chesil Street will become more dangerous to cross as residents and pubgoers alike will have to run the gamut of increased traffic roaring up Chesil Street. There will also be late-night vandalism of cars parked in Chesil Street open air car park.
- 6. Residents coming home late at night will have to park their cars in their permit places down on the old railway line and will then have to negotiate the car park on foot, to reach their homes. With noisy inebriated youngsters jostling in the area, this could be very intimidating, especially walking up around the corner of East Hill.





Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Conditions from existing licences:-

Public Entertainment Licence

There shall be no entertainment on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

The maximum number of persons permitted to be in the premises whilst in use for the purposes of this Licence shall not exceed 150 for the whole premises.

That all doors and windows that are capable of being opened directly to the outside of the premises shall not be kept open, wedged open, or maintained open by a mechanical or other device whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of this Licence

The Licensee or another person nominated by him shall be on duty at all times whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of this Licence to receive and respond to any complaints of nuisance received from any person

INSCRIPTION

There shall be affixed and kept up on some conspicuous place on the outer side of the principal door or over and outside the principal entrance of the place licensed an inscription in capital letters not less than one inch in height in the words following: -

"Licensed in pursuance of Act of Parliament for the public ... " followed by a word or words indicating the purpose for which the place is licensed.

HOURS OF OPENING

The place licensed shall not be opened for the purpose of public entertainment between 2.00am and 8.30am on any day.

RESPONSIBLE PERSON

The licensee or a responsible person nominated by the licensee in writing, not being a person being under 21 years of age shall be in charge of, and present in the place licensed at all times members of the public are present.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS

The maximum numbers of persons to be admitted at any one time to the licensed premises shall not exceed the number specified in the licence.

ATTENDANTS AND SECURITY PERSONNEL

During the time the premises are in use for public entertainment, there shall be in attendance the following numbers of staff or other attendants acquainted with the established routine to be followed in the case of fire or other emergency. The aim of the attendants should be the avoidance of panic and the orderly evacuation of the premises:-

Up to 25 persons

2 attendants

Over 25 persons

4 attendants for the first 250 persons

1 attendant for each of the additional 250 persons

Where at any licensed function the Double the above number of attendants majority of persons attending are under the age of 16 years

plus one attendant for each exit

OR SUCH LOWER NUMBER OF ATTENDANTS AS MAY BE AGREED IN WRITING BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITY

Where an attendant is responsible for security, protection, screening the suitability of people entering premises or conflict management they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

SAFETY OF PERSONS

The licensee shall take all precautions necessary for the safety of persons frequenting the licensed premises.

FORM OF ENTERTAINMENT

No public entertainment shall be permitted or suffered to take place in the place licensed which is licentious, indecent or likely to produce riot, tumult or breach of the peace.

BEHAVIOUR

The Licensee shall to the best of his ability maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour on the licensed premises whilst open for public entertainment.

NUISANCE

No public entertainment shall be permitted or suffered to take place in the place licensed which is a nuisance, annoyance or inconvenience to the occupiers of any other property.

INTOXICATION

No person shall be permitted or suffered to enter or remain within the place licensed while in a state of intoxication

OFFENDERS

If any disorderly conduct shall take place, the Licensee shall himself and his employees assist to the utmost in the apprehension or expulsion of the offenders.

HYPNOSIS

No exhibition, performance or demonstration of hypnotism shall be permitted at the place licensed except with the express written consent of the Council.

Permitted exhibitions, performances or demonstrations of hypnotism shall be in accordance with the conditions set out in the Home Office Circular 42/89.

SEATING

Seating, tables and chairs and other furniture and fittings shall be so arranged as to allow free and ready access to exits.

FLOOR COVERINGS

All floor coverings shall be secured and maintained in such a way as to prevent unevenness in the floor level.

CURTAINS AND DRAPES

Curtains shall be adequately supported and where hung across doorways or across corridors they shall be arranged as to draw easily from the centre and slide freely, and be so hung that they are clear of the floor and shall be treated with fire retardant.

TOILETS

Adequate and separate sanitary conveniences suitably marked shall be provided for persons of both sexes and shall be maintained in good working order and kept in a clean condition.

EXITS

The number, size and position of all doors or openings provided for the purpose of the egress of the public from the premises shall be to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

<u>Doors and Fastenings</u> – Unless otherwise permitted in writing by the Council, exit doors and gates shall open in the direction of exit, and shall in all cases be free from fastenings other than panic bolts or other such fastenings as shall be approved by the Council. Any panic bolts or other approved

fastenings must be signed "PUSH BAR TO OPEN" or as is appropriate to the fastening to ensure that the mode of operation is readily apparent to any person.

<u>Exit Routes</u> – All exit routes including passages, courts, ramps, and stairways, which lead from the place licensed to the outside, shall at all times be kept free from obstruction.

LIGHTING AND HEATING

<u>Provisions</u> – All parts of the place licensed shall be suitably and adequately illuminated. Except where otherwise permitted in writing by the council, all those parts to which the public have access and all exit routes shall be illuminated by at least two independent sources each of a standard approved by the Council.

<u>Standard of Illumination</u> – The illumination from each source shall be sufficient to enable the public, performers and staff to see their way out of the place licensed in safety at any time, and shall not be derived form pre-payment meters.

<u>Segregation of the Two Systems of Lighting</u> – The two or more lighting systems provided shall each be so installed so that a fault or accident arising in one system shall not jeopardise any other system.

<u>Exit Notices</u> – Each exit route from the parts of the place licensed to which the public has access shall be signed "Exit" in the manner approved by the Council. Each sign so provided must be illuminated, internally or otherwise, by at least two independent sources.

<u>Special Effects</u> – No laser beam or other hazardous effect may be used in the place licensed without prior written approval of the Council. The Licensee must give at least 21 days notice to the Council to allow adequate consideration.

The form of heating of the licensed premises shall be to the satisfaction of the Council.

<u>Safety in Heating Appliances</u> – No heating appliances shall be used in proximity to any woodwork, curtains, drapes or other materials likely to be ignited by use of the appliance.

All heating appliances must be sufficiently guarded or protected so as to avoid injury to any person.

ELECTRICAL INSPECTIONS

All electrical installations shall be inspected every three years by a competent qualified electrician to the requirements of the Institute of Electrical Engineers Wiring Regulations and a Certificate as to the condition of the electrical installations shall be furnished to the Council.

In the intervening years the electrical installations shall be inspected annually by a competent electrician.

Any alterations, modifications or extensions to the electrical installations with which the premises are provided shall be carried out by a competent electrician and shall be strictly in accordance with the Institute of Electrical Engineers Regulations. Any portable electrical appliances or equipment used in the premises shall be in efficient working order and correctly wired and connected.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS

Except with the written consent of the Council and subject to any conditions which may be attached to such consent, explosives or highly inflammable material shall not be brought in or used on the premises.

The use of naked flame shall not occur except when strictly necessary to any performance and when expressly permitted in writing by the Council.

Combustible or flammable materials or liquids shall not be stored within the place licensed except with the written consent of the Council and subject to any conditions which may be attached to such a consent.

If it appears to the council that the use of material, fabric or finish might assist the spread of fire, then it may require the material fabric or finish to be removed or treated forthwith in such a manner as to reduce the risk.

SWITCHES

All gas taps and electric switches used in connection with the lighting or heating of the place licensed shall be rendered inoperable other than by the licensee, the responsible person in charge of the place licensed and any staff or attendant employed by the Licensee.

FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

There shall be provided in the place licensed fire fighting equipment of a standard approved by the Fire Officer and acceptable to the Council. Such equipment shall be examined at least once annually by a competent person. All portable fire extinguishers shall be inspected and tested by a competent person. The date on the test to be clearly marked on a label firmly fixed to the extinguisher.

CEILINGS

Where considered necessary, provision shall be made to the Council's satisfaction, for the examination from the above of any suspended ceiling over parts of the premises to which the public have access and such other parts of the premises as the Council may deem necessary.

CONSTRUCTION

Wall and Ceiling Linings, Insulation, Treatment, etc – Any material used as a wall or ceiling lining, or as a suspended ceiling, or for acoustic or thermal insulation purposes shall be to the Council's satisfaction and shall be fixed and supported in such a manner as may be approved by the Council.

Note: For the purpose of this condition the council will normally require such material to be non-combustible or be rated class 1 of the classification for the surface spread of flame when tested in accordance with the appropriate British Standards and be throughout its thickness of no greater flammability than its surface. Certain other materials may, however, be accepted subject to compliance with such conditions as the Council may consider appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

ALTERATIONS

No structural or other alteration of the place licensed or of the means of exit there from shall be made during the continuance of this licence without the written approval of the council except such alterations as shall from time to time be approved by the licensing justices under the Licensing Acts.

NB: The council has no power to retrospectively approve unauthorised alterations made during the period of the licence.
