1. Application

Applicant: Shire Hotels Ltd

Premises: The Parsons Collar

- 1.1 This application by Shire Hotels Ltd is to vary the premises licence for the Parson Collar under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The purpose of the variation is to remove the Public Nuisance condition number 3, which states "the beer garden and external areas shall be closed to customers no later than 2200 Sunday to Thursday and 2300 Friday and Saturday."
- 1.3 Under the Health Act 2006, persons can no longer smoke in enclosed public premises and workplaces.
- 1.4 There have been no representations from the Responsible Authorities.
- 1.5 There have been eight representations from interested parties, all relating to noise nuisance. These are shown at Appendix 2.
- 1.6 There are no records of complaints noise from the premises.
- 1.7 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 3 August 2007, and advertised in the Hampshire Chronicle on 12 July 2007.

4. Observations

The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives:

- 1. Grant the licence subject to conditions in accordance with the operating schedule (modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives) and the mandatory conditions;
- 2. Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
- 3. Reject the application.

Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, necessary in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

5. Conditions

Mandatory Conditions

Under the Licensing Act 2003, the following conditions must be imposed on the Premises Licence in any event:-

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or (b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

Possible Conditions

All Licensing Objectives

No additional conditions are proposed by the licence holder, however the Sub - Committee may wish to consider additional conditions, under the prevention of public nuisance objective, if the variation is granted.

- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Crime and Disorder

- 1. All staff shall be trained to monitor all trading areas and report any suspicious incidents, criminal activity or disorder.
- 2. There shall be no irresponsible drinks promotions which may encourage binge drinking.
- 3. The licence holder shall ensure that pre-opening safety checks are carried out at the premises before each main trading session.
- 4. Before they first commence their duties at the premises, all staff shall be trained to deal with a) illegal activities and conflict management b) dealing with customers when service is refused on the basis of drunkenness.

Public Safety

- 1. The licence holder shall ensure there is a specific evacuation procedure for disabled customers is in place and staff are trained in relation to this.
- 2. The licence holder shall ensure there is annual testing and inspection of the Gas Installation, Emergency Lighting, Fire Alarm and Electrical Installation at premises by a qualified engineer.
- 3. All escape routes and exits shall be maintained so as not to cause hindrance in the event of evacuation.
- 4. The licence holder shall ensure there are robust Health and Safety systems in place with full training given to all members of staff.
- 5. The premises shall be easily accessible by emergency vehicles.

Public Nuisance

- Whilst music is being played as part of regulated entertainment, the licensee or appointed member of staff shall check periodically that noise levels are acceptable. Such monitoring shall be carried out at the boundary of the premises to ensure that local residents are not likely to be disturbed.
- 2. DJ/Public announcement shall be made at the end of licensable activities requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents, to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 3. The beer garden and external areas shall be closed to customers no later than 2200 Sunday to Thursday and 2300 Friday and Saturday.
- 4. No amplified music shall be played in any external parts of the premises.

Protection of Children


- 1. The premises shall adopt and implement the Hampshire Constabulary's Challenge 21 Scheme or another PASS accredited scheme.
- 2. All persons under the age of 18 shall be accompanied by an adult at all times.



We wish to object most strongly to the application put forward by Shire Hotels to allow the Parson's Collar to use their garden later than 10pm on weekday evenings, ie. Sunday to Thursday.

We do this primarily under the Public Nuisance order. We live opposite the back entrance to the pub, where Marjoram Avenue and Hyssop Close join. We hear loud music and noise from raised voices and laughter from the pub until 11 - 11.20pm every Friday and Saturday night, even with our double glazed windows shut. We accept this level of noise on these two weekend nights. However, this would not be acceptable on week nights, due to our right to reasonable hours of sleep to fulfil our work commitments the following day. Any babies or children trying to sleep would very likely be disturbed by this increase in noise as well.

Also, we often hear children's voices at quite a late hour from the outside area at the weekend. While this is ultimately parental choice, we feel it would be inappropriate to create further opportunity for this to occur during week days.

Furthermore, local properties would be devalued and therefore more difficult to sell if the license was extended.

Finally, we would like to point out that Shire Hotels should consider that the pub is located within a residential community. Any changes made for the benefit of their guests should not adversely impact upon the pub's immediate neighbours. We feel that these changes would!

Thank you for your email. Unfortunately, it is not currently a valid representation as you have not provided your full address.

I note your concerns with reference to public safety of children using the garden. However, this would come under separate Health and

Safety legislation. Public nuisance by children damaging the trees and blocking the stream is also not a valid concern under the Licensing Act 2003 licensing objectives. These would therefore not be taken into consideration for a licensing application.

Your reference to unacceptable noise levels could be valid under public nuisance, and may be taken into consideration when making a decision to this application. Further clarification is required to determine the type of nuisance.

I understand that Shire Hotels Ltd as the owners of the Parson's Collar have applied for an amendment to their existing license with regards to the use of their outside space. This currently restricts them to its use before 10pm sunday to thursday and before 11pm fridays and saturdays. I assume this application is on the back of recent changes in legislation with regards to smoking.

Living in close proximity to the Parson's Collar (White War was are in a good position to experience the noise levels created by the pub and the patrons that use it. Noise levels from inside the pub are not insignificant. This is especially so at weekends when loud music can be heard throughout our house, often making listening to our own TV difficult. Patrons entering and leaving the outside space will of course be doing so I assume through the patio doors making that noise disturbance even more of a problem. In terms of general noise created from the garden itself this is less of a problem normally, but even during week nights can be significant.

I was previously unaware of the clause they are seeking to remove and have certainly never seen it highlighted in the pub itself. I would also maintain that from my experience patrons not infrequently use the outside space after these times so wander what would stop this continuing if extensions were permitted.

I am not aware from the application whether removing this clause will leave any set closing times for the outside space. The ability for it to be used up until the pub closes on some weekend nights would seriously add to the current nuisance value of the noise created. I would therefore like to register my objection as part of what I believe will be a Public Nuisance issue.

Dear Sir/Madam.

I strongly **object** to the Parsons Collar in Whiteley, (owned by Shire Hotels), being granted an amendment to their existing license, which would allow them the use of the garden later than 10pm.

As it is at the moment and for several years, The Parsons Collar has been a considerable noise problem for us owners and residents of homes in Whiteley. I have two children aged 4 & 10 years, who's sleep is constantly disturbed and disrubted by noise from the parsons collar. The noise comes from noisey drinkers who are using the garden facilities, incidentally, you should know that the current restriction of 10pm has never been observed or enforced to my knowledge or experience. The noise, which consists of drunken laughter at best and fowl and abusive language at worst, generally starts at about 7pm and continues to 11:30/ 12 midnight on weekdays. On weekends it would start from about lunchtime and continue until the early hours of the morning.

This, as you can imagine, often breaks the childrens sleep up, or as is usual, makes it impossible for them to sleep in their bedrooms at all.

When we have complained to the landlord (of the day-it keeps changing you see), we are told "If you don't like it move!".

When we first bought our home in 1999, the Parsons Collar operated as a part time concern which mainly catered for lunches and refreshments for the business community.

This was acceptable practice, however since you granted the concern a full live entertainments license, ignoring the rights of the residents in favour of business, things have got completely out of control.

We now are constantly subjected to live and recorded music, the volume and bass which is so loud that it penetrates through the double glazed homes and pounds and vibrates in every room. In the summer, they open all the doors and windows of the Public House which has the effect of amplifying the noise even louder.

The Police have been aware of the problem as have the environment agency, however, it's the old problem of getting everyone of the residents engaged and objecting at once on mass. There are a few residents, who do not have children and frequent the Public house regularly who would not object, or probably notice the noise as they were part of it anyway.

In the final analysis, it was a mistake to grant them any form of license that encourages, allows and condones such a violation of human rights, furthermore it makes a mockery of the rights of residents and above all children, trying desperatly to get a few hours sleep before school the next day.

I recommend that this recent application be denied and that the existing licenses be re-evaluated with a view to being withdrawn.


