1. Application

Applicant: Mrs Susan Blazdell, Environmental Health Officer

Winchester City Council

Premises: The Stanmore Hotel, Stanmore Lane, Winchester

- 1.1 This application by Mrs Susan Blazdell, Environmental Health Manager, Winchester City Council is for the review of the Premises Licence for the Stanmore Hotel under Sections 51, 52 and 53 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The reason for the review relates to the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective following complaints of noise and disturbance from the premises, caused by persons congregating outside the premises.
- 1.3 As a result of complaints of noise, the Licensing and Registration Manager met with the then designated premises supervisor, Mr Philip Stanley and the Marston's area manager, reminding them of the conditions relating to noise pollution attached to the licence.
- 1.4 Monitoring of the premises was carried out by Mrs Blazdell, Environmental Health Officer and the Licensing and Registration Manager on Friday 8 August 2008. This monitoring was carried out from a neighbouring house. At this time there was considerable noise emanating from the rear of the premises. The noise consisted of voices, some very loud, and the use of obscene language.
- 1.5 The Licensing and Registration Manager wrote to the licence holder, Marston's, on 13 August 2008, inviting a representative of the company to meet with the Environmental Health Officer and the Licensing and Registration Manager in order to find a solution to the problem. No acknowledgement of the letter was received.
- The licence holder applied to vary the Premises Licence during the transition period prior to November 2005. The hours for the sale of alcohol were extended subject to a condition requiring a full acoustic survey and appropriate work being completed. This survey has never been undertaken and therefore the premises cannot be used for the extra hours for the sale of alcohol. The hours permitted for the provision of regulated entertainment remain unchanged.
- 1.7 No direct representations have been received since the advertising of the review, however previous complaints and noise log sheets are included at Appendix 3.
- 1.8 The application for review was received on 8 September 2008.
- 1.9 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 7 October 2008, and advertised on the Council's website and at the City Offices.
- 1.10 Notices of the hearing were sent to all Parties on 8 October 2008.

3. <u>Interested Parties</u>

No representations were received from interested parties.

4. Observations

The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application for a review with a view to promoting the following Licensing Objective:

The prevention of public nuisance

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee must have regard to all of the representations.

The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps it considers necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives:

- 1. Modify the conditions attached to the licence either permanently or for a period not exceeding three months.
- 2. Exclude a licensable activity either permanently or for a period not exceeding three months.
- 3. Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 4. Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
- Revoke the licence.

If the Sub-Committee decides that none of the above measures are necessary, they may take no action.

Licensing Objectives.

Public Nuisance

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions to prevent public nuisance caused by noise pollution from the premises having regard to the observations of the Head of Environment, the Police and the Interested Parties.

(Licensing Policy Section C)

Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, necessary in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

5. Possible Conditions

If the application for review is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following condition under the Public Nuisance objective.

- 1. The premises licence holder submits a noise management plan to the Head of Environment for approval prior to implementation in order to control the noise form patrons using the outside area. The noise management plan may include the following,
 - a) After 2200 no glassware or drinks to be taken outside and numbers limited to 10 persons at one time in the external smoking area. No groups of accompanying people are to be allowed into the area with the smokers at any time after 2200 with the intention of preventing socialising outside and to encourage people to smoke their cigarette and swiftly return to the inside of the premises.
 - b) Doors leading to garden to be kept shut at all times except for ingress and egress, to be monitored at all times
 - c) Anyone deemed to be making an unacceptable level of noise will be warned and if the warning is ignored be asked to vacate the premises
 - d) The DPS or another person nominated by him shall be on duty at all times whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of this Licence to receive and respond to any complaints of noise or other nuisance whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of the licence
 - e) Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly
 - f) Noise Monitoring Sheets to continue to be completed and maintained on a daily basis, to be made available on request for inspection by the licensing officer and/or the EHO.

6. Other Considerations

Environmental Health and Police have been for some time in receipt of complaints alleging noise disturbance from activities being held at the above premises. Principally the complaints relate to loud music during events, noise from patrons using the smoking area and leaving the area at closing time. These issues have been raised on a number of occasions with the DPS and Marstons Brewery and have been the subject of a public meeting held on 12 May 2008.

A meeting was also held with the DPS and Marstons Brewery when advice was given on methods to minimise noise disturbance which was confirmed by letter on 13 August 2008. A further meeting was also requested with the newly appointed DPS, to date there has been no response, the complaints have continued and local residents are still being disturbed.

It should be noted that at a hearing of the Licensing Sub – Committee on 29 September 2005, the premises licence was varied for longer hours for the sale of alcohol, and variation of the hours for regulated entertainment. The Committee imposed condition 7 under Public Nuisance which reads, that:

A full acoustic survey shall be undertaken by the Licensee and any appropriate noise reduction measures identified in that survey shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Director of Communities (Environmental Health) before any of the variations hereby take effect.

I understand that this work has never been completed thus the additional hours cannot be used.

Following the complaints noise monitoring has been undertaken, the latest being on Friday 8 August 2008 when the site was visited the Environmental Health Officer and Licensing Manager at 2135. At that visit it was my opinion that the noise emanating from the premises particularly the smoking area was unacceptable and was creating a significant disturbance.
I therefore recommend a review of the premises licence as it is apparent the current conditions are not preventing public nuisance in as detailed in C13 and 14 of Winchester City Council's Licensing Policy 2008.

This report is written in response to the application for review by the Environmental Health in respect of the Stanmore Hotel Winchester.

The Stanmore Hotel is situated at the top end of the Stanmore Local Authority Housing Estate in close proximity to residential properties. The premises cater for both the local community and Hotel trade with functions rooms for events.

To assist the committee with their recommendations I have taken Police records that are contained in our systems. I have only used records from the proceeding 12 months (Oct 2007 – Current)

During the above aforementioned dates 12 complaints have been recorded on our Records Management System (RMS). This system covers incidents including rowdy & inconsiderate and other recordable crimes such as assault, burglaries etc.

Six of the 12 reports refer to noise/ rowdy & inconsiderate calls. The others are not relevant to this Review Hearing application. Unfortunately the 12 reports probably do not give a true reflection of the level of noise complaints received for example via 101 calls, although Environmental Health should receive a copy.

Noise complaints alone are not generally recorded onto RMS, unless they relate to licensed premises. How complaints are recorded also depends on where they were received into the systems.

Out of 6 relevant complaints recorded on RMS, four were resulted with no further action being taken. One was resulted with the noise not considered excessive by the attending officer. The final report was resulted 'All quiet and that there had been a 50th birthday party which was packing up.'

Noise complaints without other aggravating factors are not given the highest priority for officer attendance, due to other more pressing demands on resources. Environmental Health figures would therefore be more reliable.

My personal involvement with the premises within the stated period was in October 2007. On the 12th October 2007 at 2245 hrs together with Environmental Health Officer Abbi Toms we attended one of the complainant's addresses to monitor noise from the Premises. At the rear of their address people could be clearly heard talking at the back of the Hotel on the raised decking area to the bar situated around 1st floor height.

At 1130 hrs on the 30th October 2007 together with Abbi Toms we visited the Stanmore Hotel. Advice was given to the then DPS Phillip Stanley regarding the level of complaints Environmental Health were receiving of noise and the possible consequences should complaints continue to be received.

The raised decking area at the rear of the Hotel is completely open with nothing that would appear to prevent noise pollution. The decking area also clearly overlooks the hotels car park and adjoining houses.

Since the smoking ban in public places legislation commenced in 2007 the levels of complaints received regarding noise from many licensed premises have increased.






Dear Ms Toms

Thank you for your letter of 19 December. I am very sorry not to have replied earlier. I am also sorry that I have not returned the log sheet.

I have to confess that my husband and I lead very busy professional and personal lives, that it not has been possible for us to maintain records of noise levels from the pub. We are no doubt that having lived in this property since 1975 the level of noise is totally unacceptable. At least on a dozen occasions between September and now the music has been loud going onto about 1145 and later, a lot of fighting, shouting, screaming in the pub and surrounding areas. On Thursday 6 September was a good example of shouting taking place around 815pm and continued for some time. Again a Saturday in the early part of August, around 430pm, there was a drunken brawl with a lot of shouting and foul language which continued for about half an hour. The music played is always loud, windows and doors are never shut and there are often disturbances late at night, after 1130pm. Children are heard running around screaming quite late even after 7pm. This level of disturbance has become most marked after the indoor smoking ban. The noise levels are at an all time high.

Obviously the summer months are particularly difficult but I definitely remember the third week in November when there were two or three nights which were very difficult as the noise level and shouting was present even at 1130/1145pm. I note that in other parts of Winchester City action has been taken and pubs have been asked to introduce appropriate soundproofing of their premises. This is the least you can do as where we live is a quiet residential area and has now been converted into a noisy hub of activity, loud music, drunken brawls several evenings and nights of the week, especially in the summer but also less frequently over the winter period. If you still want me to maintain records, I will do so, hopefully from 15 January.

I look forward to hearing from you.





- 2. During televised sporting events the applicants shall ensure that table service is provided.

Public Nuisance

- 1. Whilst music is being played as part of regulated entertainment, the licensee or appointed member of staff shall check periodically that noise levels are acceptable. Such monitoring shall be carried out at the boundary of the premises to ensure that local residents are not likely to be disturbed.
- 2. Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents, to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 3. Staff shall be given appropriate instructions and training to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly and not to loiter in the vicinity of the premises so as to minimize disturbance to local residents.
- 4. Regulated entertainment shall be restricted to the inside of the premises.
- 5. All external doors and windows must be kept closed, other than for access and egress, in all rooms when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place.
- 6. Soft drinks and coffee shall be made available during the cooling down period.

7. A full acoustic survey shall be undertaken by the Licensee and any appropriate noise reduction measures identified in that survey shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Director of Communities before any of the variations hereby permitted take effect.
