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Part A.

1. Application

Applicant: Knowle Community Buildings Association

Premises: Knowle Village Hall

1.1 This is an application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 for a new premises licence for Knowle Village hall.

1.2 The application is to provide the following licensable activities on a maximum of six occasions per year:-

Plavs

Films

Indoor Sporting Events

Live Music

Recorded Music

Performances of Dance

Provision of facilities for making music

Provision of facilities for dancing

Supply of Alcohol (consumption on premises only)

- 1.3 The Operating Schedule, copied at Appendix 1, proposes the Relevant Licensable Activities.
- 1.4 The premises is a listed building which was formerly the Knowle Hospital chapel. It is situated in a residential area and surrounded by dwelling houses.
- 1.5 Representations were received from four interested parties covering all licensing objectives. One representation has since been withdrawn.
- 1.6 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 17 February 2010, and advertised in the Knowle Village Post on 23 January 2010.
- 1.7 Hearing notices were sent to all parties on 22 February 2010.

Designated Premises Supervisor

If the application is granted, Section 41 D (3) Licensing Act 2003 would apply. The mandatory condition relating to the designated premises supervisor would be disapplied and the management committee would be responsible for the sale of alcohol.

4. Observations

The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee must have regard to all of the representations.

The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps it considers necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Grant the licence subject to conditions in accordance with the operating schedule (modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives) and the mandatory conditions:
- 2. exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- 3. refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- 4. reject the application.

Crime and Disorder

(Licensing Policy Part 4, D6, D7)

Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, necessary in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

5. Conditions

Mandatory Conditions

Under the Licensing Act 2003, the following conditions must be imposed on the Premises Licence in any event:-

- 1. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be authorised by the management committee.
- 2. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 3. No film shall be exhibited unless it has received a U, PG, 12, 15 or 18 certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, or it is a current newsreel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification. The admission of children shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendations of the British Board of Film Classification.

Possible Conditions

If the application is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following conditions to reflect the Operating Schedule:

- All doors and windows that are capable of being opened directly to the outside of the premises shall not be kept open whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of regulated entertainment.
- 2. Whilst music is being played as part of regulated entertainment, the licensee or appointed member of staff shall check periodically that noise levels are acceptable. Such monitoring shall be carried out at the boundary of the premises to ensure that local residents are not likely to be disturbed.

- 3. Staff shall be given appropriate instructions and training to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly and not to loiter in the vicinity of the premises so as to minimize disturbance to local residents.
- 4. A noise limiter shall be installed, calibrated and maintained to the satisfaction of the Head of Environment to control all amplified entertainment.
- 5. All events shall be restricted to the inside of the premises.

Protection of Children

1. No child shall be permitted at an event on the premises unless accompanied by an adult.

P Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Any event to which the public has access with or without payment will be supervised by one or more members of the committee. The number of supervisors will be dependent on the type of event and the number of people expected to attend. Public events will be restricted to ticket only.

The majority of events will also be supervised by the hall manager who is suitably qualified to conduct that role.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The principle concern of the applicant is that public order be maintained and that people attending events leave the building in a quite and orderly manner to minimise disturbance to the residents.

Whilst crime in Knowle is very low there are problem families and problem children but their identities are known and some are already excluded from the building.

Any incidents that require action by the Police will be reported to them.

c) Public safety

The building is restricted to 220 persons by Hampshire Fire service and that number will not be exceeded.

The building has regular fire inspections and is well served by emergency exits and a modern fire alarm system.

The layout of the building together with the restricted number of persons means that crush injuries are extremely unlikely. There is a comprehensive first aid kit and normally qualified first aiders on the premises.

All electrical appliances are annually PAT tested. Any equipment being brought onto the site by outside agencies is also required to be so tested.

The hall manager is health and safety trained and will risk assess on a regular basis.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All persons leaving the premises are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

The building is used mainly by the community of Knowle and does not lend itself to visitors from outside as there is only parking for four vehicles. This means that hall users normally arrive on foot.

Any identified troublemakers will not be allowed access. Any problems inside the hall will be dealt with by responsible adults and, if necessary, those responsible will be required to leave.

The following points are all to prevent excess noise and/or nuisance and hopefully satisfy the requirements of local residents:

- 1. The applicants do not anticipate any high profile events that would attract outside crowds but any such event would be risk assessed and outside security brought in if it was deemed desirable. There will be no more than 6 events per annum.
- 2. All regulated entertainment shall cease at 2300 hours.

- 3. A noise limiter shall be installed, set and maintained to the satisfaction of the Head of Environment to control all amplified music.
- 4. All amplification equipment shall be routed through the calibrated noise limiter.
- 5. All doors and windows that are capable of being opened directly to the outside of the premises shall not be kept open whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of regulated entertainment.
- 6. Whilst music is being played as part of regulated entertainment, the licensee or appointed member of staff shall check periodically that noise levels are acceptable. Such monitoring shall be carried out at the boundary of the premises to ensure that local residents are not likely to the disturbed.

e) The protection of children from harm

Any child attending an event inside the hall is required to be accompanied by a responsible adult. On occasions adults leave children for particular events. At those times a register is kept and no child is allowed to leave before the return of that adult or there previously identified representative.

The doors are kept secured and supervised. A high adult/child ratio is also maintained dependant on the age of the child concerned.

Children would be excluded from unsuitable events and age restrictions would be observed in the event of films being shown.

Application is ongoing for a CRB check for the hall manager. Other hall supervisors for the various groups already have such checks in place.



Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to you to voice my concerns over the application for a premises license for Knowle Village Hall, Knowle Avenue, Knowle, Fareham.

My objections to the licence concern primarily 4 of the items listed on the proposed purpose of the application:

- Live Music 1000 2300
- Recorded Music 1000 2300
- Provision of facilities for making music 1000 2200
- Supply of alcohol 1200 2300

If this licence were to be granted, I believe there would be a detrimental effect on public safety, a public nuisance would be created and serious concerns raised about the protection of children from harm. I would now like to explain my reason for stating this in this representation:-

1. The premises of Knowle Village Hall on Knowle Avenue are unsuitable for the purposes of live music, recorded music and the provision of facilities for making music. The building is not sound proofed and the windows and doors are regularly open, which allows and accentuates the sound/noise to permeate to local residences. This is noise pollution and a public nuisance and when residents are pursuing activities within their own homes or gardens, this is unacceptable. Where this licence to be granted and problems continue of an environmental health nature, it is a current problem that no one from environmental health is available to attend. I have an email from Therese Evans of Winchester City Council which states the following from Winchester Environmental Health dept:-

[&]quot;I have been dealing with the Public Entertainments Licence Application as well as complaints from

the premises. I have visited, made an assessment and given advice to the Association on these matters. I am of the opinion that music events cannot take place at this venue after 11pm, without some alterations to the building and EVEN BEFORE 11PM, AS IF NOT CONTROLLED PROPERLY, THEY WILL DISTURB MANY IMMEDIATE NEIGHBOURS. I HAVE ADVISED THE COMPLAINANTS OF THE SITUATION".

- 2. Parking remains an issue within the boundaries of Knowle Village and currently vehicles are parked on both sides of the road, on corners etc, which does concern both myself and others greatly as to the safety of both children and adults either playing or indeed trying to cross the road. This is a serious concern and the safety of the public is at risk both for pedestrians and drivers trying to negotiate what are already narrow roads with cars parked around blind corners. On several occasions I have also witnessed light goods vehicles, mounting the pavements to back up to the side door of the Village Hall for both loading and unloading purposes surely this is unacceptable when pedestrians are trying to walk on that same pavement and is unsafe when that light goods vehicle then tries to back onto the road again? This is made worse when events finish at 11pm and it is dark when this is happening.
- 3. I should like to point out that when events are held in the Knowle Village Hall they do not always end promptly at 11pm and for local residents this does involve additional noise when people are leaving in their cars and equipment is being loaded into vehicles sometimes noise can go on until midnight. This is a public nuisance. We have voiced our concerns over these issues to the Residents Association over the years, but this has to date been disregarded.
- 4. When events are held in the Knowle Village Hall, I have witnessed people standing outside the side door of the chapel drinking bottles of beer. I believe this is a public nuisance.

My representation also takes account of the fact that I strongly believe where this application to be granted, it would be absolutely contrary to the Charter of the Fundamental Rights of the European Union which sets out the rights of European citizens and all persons resident in the eu. They are based in particular on the fundamental rights and freedoms by the European Convention on Human Rights. Article 7 of chapter 1 Dignity clearly states that:-

"respect for private and family life everyone has the right to respect for his or her private and family life, home and communications".

Where this application to be granted i see no respect for my family or many others living nearby whose family and home life would be unrespected as our safety would be at risk and we would be subject to a public nuisance and our children potentially unprotected.

The European Union have stated that noise above a certain volume according to the European Environment Agency affects not only wellbeing, but also the health of citizens.

I should be pleased if you could inform me when this application is to be heard as I would like to attend and that this representation has been received.

I write to object to the above Premises License application on the grounds that the following licensable activities are a 'public nuisance':

- Live Music 1000 2300
- Recorded Music 1000 2300
- Provision of facilities for making music 1000 2200

Previous complaints from local residents have been registered with the Environmental Health department of Winchester City Council due to excessive noise pollution from private functions held at Knowle Village Hall.

The building is located in a residential area and no provision was made for acoustic insulation when converting it from a chapel to a village hall. Whilst I understand that recent intervention from a local councillor has led to a minor reduction in noise tevels, it is still an unacceptable venue for the playing of live and recorded music at any time.


