#### Part A.

#### 1. Application

Applicant: Slug and Lettuce Company Limited

Premises: Slug and Lettuce

- 1.1 This report is to consider the application for the variation of the premises licence for the Slug and Lettuce.
- 1.2 The premises is a modern public house situated in the Square, Winchester.
- 1.3 The application is to vary the licensable activities to a terminal hour for the existing licensable activities of 0200 on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. (Appendix 1a)
- 1.4 The operating schedule also offers conditions under the crime and disorder objective relating to door supervisors and late entry to the premises.
- 1.5 The current premises licence allows the provision of regulated entertainment by way of films, live and recorded music, dancing, late night refreshment and the sale of alcohol until a terminal hour of midnight each day. (Appendix 1b)
- 1.6 The licence also allows the hours to be extended by 1 hour on; 14 February, 23 December, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Years Day, St. Patrick's Day, St. George's Day, St. Andrews Day, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of Bank Holiday weekends.
- 1.7 The above hours may be extended on up to 12 occasions per calendar year subject to the Licensee serving at least seven working days' notice on the Police and the licensing authority.
- On New Year's Eve the licensable activities are extended to the start of the normal hours for 1 January each year.
- 1.9 The current designated premises supervisor is Diana Frizzell
- 1.10 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 23 August 2010, and advertised in The Hampshire Chronicle on 29 July 2010.
- 1.11 A representation was received from the Head of Environmental Protection. He suggested a reduction in the hours applied for from 0200 to 0130 on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays, and included some

conditions to address the public nuisance objective. (Appendix 2a)

- 1.12 A representation was received from the Police relating to the crime and disorder objective. The police required conditions attached to the premises licence relating to the installation and use of a CCTV system (Appendix 2b)
- 1.13 Both of these responsible authorities' representations were forwarded to the applicant but no agreement was reached.
- 1.14 Representations were also received from three interested parties. All were concerned with the potential for public nuisance. (Appendix 3)
- 1.15 Conditions relating to the protection of children objective have been agreed with the head of Trading standards. These conditions are shown under the relevant heading in section 5 of the report.

#### 4. Observations

The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee must have regard to all of the representations.

The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps it considers necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Grant the variation subject to conditions in accordance with the operating schedule (modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives) and the mandatory conditions;
- 2. exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- 3. reject the application.

#### **Terminal hours**

The Sub-Committee should take account of the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy with regard to terminal hours and take such steps as it considers necessary to promote the Licensing Objectives.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, A8)

#### Licensing Objectives.

#### Crime and Disorder

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions to prevent crime and public disorder relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the observations of the police.

(Licensing Policy 1.6, 2.11, 2.17)

#### **Public Safety**

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions relating to public safety having regard to the Council's licensing policy.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, B3, B4)

#### **Public Nuisance**

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions to prevent public nuisance caused by noise and light pollution from the premises having regard to the observations of the Head of Environmental Protection and the Interested Parties.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, Section C)

#### Protection of Children

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions for the Protection of Children having regard to the Council's licensing policy.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, D6, D7)

#### **Human Rights**

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, necessary in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

#### 5. Conditions

#### **Mandatory Conditions**

Under the Licensing Act 2003, the following conditions are imposed on the Premises Licence in any event:-

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or (b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. No film shall be exhibited unless it has received a U, PG, 12, 15 or 18 certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, or it is a current newsreel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification. The admission of children shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendations of the British Board of Film Classification.
- 5. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The following conditions will apply from 1 October 2010.

- 8. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 9. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 10. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

#### Operating Hours

If the variation is granted, the Sub Committee should specify the hours for licensable activities.

#### **Possible Conditions**

If the application is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following **additional** conditions to reflect the Operating Schedule:

#### Crime and Disorder

- A CCTV System must be installed and maintained to a standard agreed with Police. The system must be capable of producing evidential standard quality images on a real time basis operating in normal conditions within the public areas.
- 2. All public areas must be covered by CCTV. This must include the front door and bar areas and must be capable of providing good quality head and shoulder images.
- 3. All images must be retained for 30 days and made available to an authorised officer on request.
- 4. There must always be a member of staff capable of operating the CCTV system whilst the premises are open for licensable activity.
- 5. Any images recovered must be in a format that can be readily taken away and viewed on any computer operating on any windows based program acceptable to the Police, or DVD player. This will be without the requirement for addition software to be installed.
- 6. The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity.

#### **Public Safety**

None

#### **Public Nuisance**

 All doors and windows that are capable of being opened directly to the outside of the premises shall not be kept open whilst the premises are in use for the purposes of regulated entertainment.

- 2. A noise limiter shall be installed, calibrated and maintained to the satisfaction of the Head of Environmental Protection to control all amplified entertainment.
- 3. Staff shall be given appropriate instructions and training to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly and not to loiter in the vicinity of the premises so as to minimize disturbance to local residents.

#### **Protection of Children**

- An electronic refusals record shall be kept of all refusals to sell alcohol.
  Door staff will record refusals to allow entry in the incident log book ( or similar). The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that records of all refusals are monitored on a monthly basis.
- 2. All staff shall be trained to challenge every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age and to refuse service where individuals cannot produce acceptable means of identification, which shall be a passport, photo driving licence or PASS accredited photo ID. Such training shall be provided not less than every six months, and written records shall be kept of all training and refresher training.
- 3. 'Challenge 21' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

Should an incident occur at a Licensed Premises we must be in a postion to remove and view any CCTV footage for an effective investigation. Any footage recovered must be of an evidential standard, with any installation installed to a standard agreed with Police.

The conditions we seek on this Premises Licence regarding CCTV are as follows.

A CCTV System must be installed and maintained to a standard agreed with Police. The system must be capable of producing evidential standard quality images on a real time basis operating in normal conditions within the public areas. All public areas must be covered by CCTV. This must include the front door and bar areas and must be capable of providing good quality head and shoulder images. All images must be retained for 30 days and made available to an authorised officer on request. There must always be a member of staff capable of operating the CCTV system whilst the premises are open for licensable activity. As proprietors of the Old Vine, a business in the immediate vicinity of the Slug and Lettuce in the Square, we are writing to make a representation with regards to the proposed variation to the Slug and Lettuce's premises license.

The Old Vine operates as a bar and restaurant with guest accommodation. We are concerned that an extension of the Slug and Lettuce's licensable activities from midnight until 2am on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays might negatively affect the Old Vine's offering of guest accommodation.

At present we operate five rooms at the Old Vine, with three rooms facing directly out on to the Square. Although we have fitted these rooms with shutters and heavy curtains, and supply ear plugs for guests to use, guests regularly complain about the level of noise coming from the Square late at night. Typically this is on Thursday, Friday or Saturday nights as venues with late-night licenses, both in the immediate area and further afield, close and customers make their way back through the city. The Square and the cathedral green act as a focal point for people to gather – sometimes these people are drunk, loud or aggressive, and guests checking out from the Old Vine have reported disturbances as late as 4am. A verbal complaint received from a guest about the evening of Thursday 29 July 2010 noted that an organized event was taking place at the Slug and Lettuce, with many people gathered outside the venue on the pavement, to both smoke and drink. The high level of music coming from within the venue and the general noise caused by large numbers of people gathered in one place were also noted. We can contact the guest to provide further information if you wish.

Our concern is that an extension of the Slug and Lettuce's opening hours may lead to an increase in complaints of this nature. It is possible that an extension to the license may lead to public nuisance through: disorder in public areas through excessive consumption of alcohol by customers taking advantage of later opening hours at the Slug and Lettuce, where they and others coming from venues across the city may congregate and continue drinking after other venues in the city have closed; noise pollution from large numbers of people gathered on the pavement outside the venue to smoke and drink as late as 2am; noise pollution by music, both live and recorded, from within the venue; and an increase in the level of general noise as customers leave the venue from as late as 2am. It may take some time for these customers to disperse after leaving the venue, many of whom will be in high spirits, and it is quite likely that disturbances will be experienced in the local vicinity for some time after 2am.

It is reasonable to expect some degree of noise when staying in a venue located in a busy city-centre, and the majority of guests staying at the Old Vine accept this. However, it is also reasonable to expect to be able to retire to bed and sleep soundly at a venue offering guest accommodation, at a time that suits the majority of guests; we would suggest that this would be no later than midnight.

Licensing Act 2003 – Application for variation of premises licence PREM 324 Slug and Lettuce, 12-13 The Square, Winchester, SO23 9ES

We are writing to object to the granting of the above licence variation in view of its likely negative impact on the promotion of the prevention of public nuisance.

Of particular concern is the possibility of any additional noise and anti-social behaviour of which we have many years' experience and about which we would be pleased to provide further details. For example, elevated noise levels and rowdy behaviour associated with a nearby nightclub results in local residents, as well as bed-and-breakfast visitors staying at The Old Vine in Great Minster Street, being regularly woken up between midnight and 2.30 a.m. (In this regard, an on-going log detailing the occurrence of unacceptably high noise levels from this establishment will shortly be submitted to Winchester City Council.).

Although the main entrance to the Slug and Lettuce is in The Square, there is a rear fire exit opening onto Little Minster Street and the possible use of these doors to provide extra ventilation and/or to allow customers to leave at varying times could result in additional noise and disturbance in what is still essentially a residential area.

We do, however, appreciate that the proprietors of such businesses cannot take responsibility for any anti-social behaviour of customers once they have left the premises, but it is nearby residents who suffer the consequences.


