## 1. Application

Applicant: The Restaurant Group (UK) Ltd

Premises: Coast to Coast, Whiteley Shopping Centre

- 1.1 This report relates to an application for a premises licence for the restaurant Coast to Coast at Whiteley Shopping Centre
- 1.2 The purpose of the application is for recorded music, late night refreshment and the supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises.
- 1.3 The recorded music is for the hours of 0800 to 0030 Monday to Sunday and from the end of permitted hours News Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours New Years Day.
- 1.4 Late night refreshment is applied for the hours of 2300 to 0030 Monday to Sunday and 2300 on New Years Eve to 0500 New Years Day.
- 1.5 The supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises is for the hours of 1000 to 0000 Monday to Sunday and from the end of permitted hours News Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours New Years Day.
- 1.6 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 1 February 2014, and advertised in the Portsmouth news on 9 January 2014.
- 1.7 The Operating Schedule, copied at Appendix 1, proposes the Relevant Licensable Activities.
- 1.8 No representations were received from the Responsible Authorities.
- 1.9 Representations were received from Councillor Sam Newman-McKie and Councillor Vivian Achwall, both Whiteley ward Councillors, to the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.
- 1.10 Councillor Achwall withdrew her representation after the applicant agreed to a condition prohibiting the use of the outside terrace area for licensable activities after 2300 Sunday to Thursday and 2330 on Friday and Saturday.
- 1.11 The licensable hours for indoors are to remain the same as applied for.

- 1.12 Councillor Newman-McKie did not agree that this condition would be sufficient and would like her representation to remain.
- 1.13 Notices of the hearing were sent to all Parties on 6 February 2014.

- 1. Grant the licence subject to conditions in accordance with the operating schedule (modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives) and the mandatory conditions;
- 2. exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- 3. refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- 4. reject the application.

## Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, necessary in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

## 5. <u>Conditions</u>

Mandatory Conditions

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or (b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 7. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 8. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that-
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
    - (i) beer or cider: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

## Possible Conditions

If the application is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following conditions to reflect the Operating Schedule:

### Operating Hours

1. The hours the premises may be used the provision of late night refreshment shall be:

## (i) Monday to Sunday 2300 to 0030 (It is proposed in the representation to end at 2330)

2. The hours the premises may be used for the sale of alcohol shall be:

(i) Monday to Sunday 1000 to 0000 (It is proposed in the representation to end at 2330)

3. The hours the premises may be used for late night refreshment shall be:

### (i) Monday to Sunday 2300 to 0030 (It is proposed in the representation to end at 2330)

3. The hours the premises may open for other than Licensable Activities shall be:

(i) Monday to Sunday 0800 to 0030 (It is proposed in the representation to end at 2330)

## All Licensing Objectives

#### **Crime and Disorder**

1. CCTV shall be installed in the premises and recordings shall be retained for 28 days and shall be made available to the Licensing Authority of Police on request.

## **Public Safety**

1. None

## Public Nuisance

1. The outside terrace area shall not be used for licensable activities after 2300 Sunday to Thursday and 2330 Friday and Saturday.

# Protection of Children

- 1. The premises shall adopt and implement the Hampshire Constabulary's Challenge 21 Scheme.
- 2. Staff shall be trained in their responsibility under the Licensing Act 2003. Records of staff training shall be available for inspection upon request.

## 6. <u>Other Considerations</u>

## **Corporate Strategy (Relevance To:)**

This report covers issues which affect the principles of Active Communities and a Prosperous Economy.

#### **Resource Implications**

A licence fee of £315 has been received. An annual fee of £295 will be payable on the anniversary of the grant of the licence. 
