1. Application

Applicant: Pizza Express (Restaurants) Limited

Premises: Pizza Express, Unit F3 Whiteley Shopping Centre, Whiteley Way,

Fareham, PO15 7PD

1.1 This report relates to an application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 for Pizza Express, Whiteley Shopping Centre.

- 1.2 The purpose of the application is to provide regulated entertainment (recorded music), late night refreshment and supply of alcohol.
- 1.3 The applicant requested recorded music Monday to Sunday 1100 to 0030 each day and New Years Eve 1100 until 1100 New Years Day, indoors only.
- 1.4 Late night refreshment has been applied for Monday to Sunday 2300 to 0030 each day and New Years Eve 1100 until 1100 New Years Day.
- 1.5 The supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises is for the hours of 1100 to 0000 each day and New Years Eve 1100 until 1100 New Years Day.
- 1.6 The applicant has agreed to amend their application for the terminal hours on New Years Eve until 0200 New Years Day, following concerns from Hampshire Constabulary.
- 1.7 The applicant has also agreed conditions with Hampshire Constabulary relating to the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children licensing objectives. These conditions can be found on pages 8 and 9 below and at Appendix 3a.
- 1.8 A representation was received from a Parish Councillor, Malcolm Smith who has concerns relating to the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance licensing objectives.
- 1.9 Cllr Smith has made a representation in a personal capacity, not on behalf of Whiteley Parish Council.
- 1.10 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 14 April 2014, and advertised in the Portsmouth Evening News on 21 March 2014.
- 1.11 Notices of the hearing were sent to all Parties on 29 April 2014.

1.12 The Operating Schedule, copied at Appendix 1, proposes the Relevant Licensable Activities.

4. Observations

The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee must have regard to all of the representations.

The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps it considers appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives:

- 1. Grant the licence subject to conditions in accordance with the operating schedule (modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives) and the mandatory conditions;
- 2. exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- 3. refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- 4. reject the application.

Terminal hours

The Sub-Committee should take account of the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy with regard to terminal hours and take such steps as it considers appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, A8)

Licensing Objectives.

Crime and Disorder

The Sub-Committee should consider any appropriate conditions to prevent crime and public disorder relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy 1.6, 2.11, 2.17)

Public Safety

The Sub-Committee should consider any appropriate conditions relating to public safety having regard to the relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, B3, B4)

Public Nuisance

The Sub-Committee should consider any appropriate conditions to prevent public nuisance caused by noise and light pollution from the premises relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, Section C)

Protection of Children

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions for the Protection of Children relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, D6, D7)

Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, appropriate in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

5. <u>Conditions</u>

Mandatory Conditions

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or (b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. Where individuals are required on premises to carry out security activities, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 7. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 8. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Possible Conditions

If the application is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following conditions to reflect the Operating Schedule:

1. The hours the premises may be used for regulated entertainment shall be:

Recorded music – indoors only

(i) Monday to Sunday	1100 to 0030
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(ii) New Years Eve 1100 to 0200 New Years Day

2. The hours the premises may be used the provision of late night refreshment shall be:

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(ii) New Years Eve 2300 to 0200 New Years Day

3. The hours the premises may be used for the sale of alcohol shall be:

All Licensing Objectives

- 1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that when licensable activity is taking place and a Personal Licence Holder is not present at the premises, a responsible person aged over 18 shall be present who has written authorisation from the DPS to sell alcohol. This person shall be trained in licensing matters and be fully competent to deal with all licensing issues that may arise within the premises. This persons training shall be documented and made available to the Police and other responsible authorities upon request.
- 2. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a training package is in place in order for all staff involved with the sale or supply to be sufficiently trained in licensing matters proportionate to their role and aware of their responsibilities.
- 3. Records shall be kept of this training, dated and signed by the staff member and trainer. Refresher training shall be completed at least every 12 months again with documented records made and to be available for inspection from Police and other responsible authorities.
- 4. A written record shall be retained to show the staff that staff that have been authorised to sell alcohol. This shall be made available to the Police and other responsible authorities on request.
- 5. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a system is in place to ensure that every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises, shall produce acceptable photographic means of identification and age confirmation. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

6. Other Considerations

Resource Implications

A licence fee of £315 has been received. An annual fee of £295 will be payable on the anniversary of the grant of the licence. It is anticipated that an appropriate level of officer attendance will be provided within the existing budget.



I write to object to the license applied for by Pizza Express for the premises to be situated in Whitley Shopping Centre.

My objection is against:

- (1) Late night music until 00.30 Mon Sun time and the from 11.00 New Years Eve through to 11.00 the next day.
- (2) Late night refreshment 23.00 00.30 Mon Sun and from 23.00 New Years Eve through to 23.00 the next day.
- (3) Supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises until 00.00 Mon Sun and from 11.00 New Years eve through to 11.00 the next day.

My objection is on the material basis of public nuisance to local residents and the prevention of crime and order in the area.

The proposed site (block F) is in close proximity to residents' properties, particularly in Camellia Way and Bluebell Way and the noise would have a detrimental affect to the residents living there. This would be exacerbated by the extra hours on New Years Eve.

The extended sale of alcohol during the week, both to be consumed off and on the premises, would encourage excessive drinking and is likely to encourage crime and disorder, a possible risk to public safety and thus public nuisance.

The extended hours for late refreshment and sale of alcohol on and off the premises on New Years eve through to the the early hours of Jan 2nd is totally unacceptable and is encouraging anti social behaviour through excessive drinking; therefore, again, causing public nuisance and crime and disorder. As an aside, it is also contradicts all attempts made by Government and other agencies to reduce excessive drinking and reduce the on-going cost to the tax payer of such activities.

These extended hours obviously mean that the opening times over the New Year period would be continuous and I also consider that this is not acceptable for Whiteley residents either.

Whiteley is foremost a residential area with developing recreational strands and it's own character needs to preserved as it grows. Residents should be

protected from it becoming a late night entertainment hub with the associated detrimental consequences.

I propose the following as acceptable:

- (1) Late night music and late night refreshment until 23.30 Mon to Sun, with a one hour extension to 00.30 on New Years Eve.
- (2) Supply of Alcohol to be limited to on premises consumption only in line with hours in (1).
- (3) Opening hours on New Years Eve to be limited to 00.30 with a half hour extra for closing premises down.

I would welcome to the opportunity to address the committee to express my objections and I trust my representation will be taken into consideration by the committee.

I write with reference to the new premises licence application for Pizza Express at Whiteley.

The Police position is that the requested extensions of licensable activity are acceptable subject to a few sensible conditions added to the premises licence which I shall list below.

However, the request to extend hours of licensable activity throughout the night on New Years Eve seems a little unnecessary. It is accepted that New Years Eve may require a later extension of hours but 1am would seem to be a fully acceptable terminal hour for licensable activity on that night based on the type of business. Please come back to me on this point.

I'd also be interested in how the premises intend to use the 'off sales' at the premises as is requested in the application.

Requested conditions for agreement to application (assuming NYE issue is agreed).

- 1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that when licensable activity is taking place and a Personal Licence Holder is not present at the premises, a responsible person aged over 18 shall be present who has written authorisation from the DPS to sell alcohol. This person shall be trained in licensing matters and be fully competent to deal with all licensing issues that may arise within the premises. This persons training shall be documented and made available to the Police and other responsible authorities upon request.
- 2. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a refusals book / incident book or log is maintained at the premises. These records shall be retained for a minimum of 1 year and be made available to the Police and other responsible authorities upon request.
- 3. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a training package is in place in order for all staff involved with the sale or supply to be sufficiently trained in licensing matters proportionate to their role and aware of their responsibilities.

 Records shall be kept of this training, dated and signed by the staff member and trainer.

 Refresher training shall be completed at least every 12 months again with documented records made and to be available for inspection from Police and other responsible authorities.

A written record shall be retained to show the staff that staff that have been authorised to sell alcohol. This shall be made available to the Police and other responsible authorities on request.

4. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a system is in place to ensure that every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises, shall produce acceptable photographic means of identification and age confirmation. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

I am conscious that the expiry date for representations is 11th April.
