The document will also be published on the Council's website. Please note, signatures, telephone numbers and email addresses will not be published. **Please notify us if you do not wish for your details to appear by Friday 20 May 2016. If we do not hear from you by this date we shall take this as confirmation for your details to appear in the public document.** If you do not wish your details to appear, your representation cannot be considered.

Relevant representations relate to one or more of the four licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. They should also relate to matters that are within the control of the licence holder.

When relevant representations are received for an application, the authority must hold a hearing to determine the application by the Licensing Sub Committee.

Any party making a relevant representation will be invited to the hearing and, subject to the return of a hearing notice, may address the Licensing Sub Committee. Oral representations must relate to the written representation. No new evidence may be introduced at the hearing.
