1. Application

Applicant: Tesco Stores Ltd

Premises: Tesco, 120-121 High Street, Winchester, SO23 9AS

- 1.1 This report relates to a new Premises Licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 for Tesco, 120-121 High Street, Winchester, Hampshire SO23 9AS.
- 1.2 The purpose of the application is to allow for the supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises between 0700 and 2300 Monday to Sunday.
- 1.3 Representations were received from local residents and other members of the public objecting to the application in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance licensing objectives.
- 1.4 A petition was received by the Licensing Section on 6 July 2017 with 230 signatories objecting to the application in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance licensing objectives.
- 1.5 A letter was sent to the 170 of those signatories who had provided legible contact details, on 10 July 2017 requesting confirmation as to whether they consented to their name and address forming part of a public document (this report). Responses were received from 34 signatories.
- 1.6 The list of residents who have submitted representations or signed the petition can be found at Section 3 of the report and copies of the representations and petition can be found at appendix 2.
- 1.7 PC Matthew Moss on behalf of Hampshire Constabulary and the applicant, Tesco Stores Ltd, have agreed conditions which can be found at appendix 3.
- 1.8 No representations were received from any other Responsible Authority.
- 1.9 The applicant has been provided with a copy of all relevant representations and the petition.
- 1.10 Notice of the application was displayed outside of the premises for a period of 28 days until 9 July 2017, and advertised in the Hampshire Chronicle on 15 June 2017.
- 1.11 Notices of the hearing were sent to all parties on 19 July 2017.

4. Observations

- 4.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm
- 4.2 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.
- 4.3 The Sub-Committee must have regard to all of the representations.
- 4.4 The licensing authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps shown below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:-
 - a) Grant the licence subject to conditions in accordance with the operating schedule (modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives) and the mandatory conditions;
 - b) Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) Reject the application

Terminal hours

The Sub-Committee should take account of the National Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy with regard to terminal hours and take such steps as it considers appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, A8)

Licensing Objectives.

Crime and Disorder

The Sub-Committee should consider any appropriate conditions to prevent crime and public disorder relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy 1.9, 2.11, 2.17 and Part 4 Section A)

Public Safety

The Sub-Committee should consider any appropriate conditions relating to public safety having regard to the relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, B3, B4)

Public Nuisance

The Sub-Committee should consider any appropriate conditions to prevent public nuisance caused by noise and light pollution from the premises relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, Section C)

Protection of Children

The Sub-Committee should consider any necessary conditions for the Protection of Children relating to the premises having regard to the operating schedule and the representations.

(Licensing Policy Part 4, D6, D7)

Human Rights

It is considered that Articles 6 (right to a fair trial) 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and Article 1 of the First Protocol (right to peaceable enjoyment of possessions) may be relevant. As there is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court, it is considered that there would be no infringement of Article 6. Article 8 is relevant, insofar as the nearby residents could claim that this right would be infringed by disturbance from customers. This should be balanced against the applicants' right to use of their premises under Article 1 of the First Protocol. Interference with these rights is permitted, where this interference is lawful, appropriate in a democratic society, and proportionate. Likewise, the residents may argue that their rights under Article 1 of the First Protocol would be infringed. If conditions are imposed, there should be no interference with any convention rights. To the extent that any interference may occur, it would be justifiable in a democratic society, and proportionate.

5. Conditions

The Mandatory Conditions are imposed on a premises licence in any case.

Mandatory Conditions

Where the Licence Authorises Supply of Alcohol:

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014

- effective from 1 October 2014

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014 – effective from 28 May 2014

- A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula- P = D + (D x V) where-
 - (i) **P** is the permitted price,

- D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph
 - (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Possible Conditions

If the application is granted, the Sub-Committee may wish to consider the following conditions to reflect the Operating Schedule:

Operating Hours

- 1. The hours the premises may be used for the sale of alcohol shall be:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday 0700 to 2300

All Licensing Objectives

[Dealt with in relevant sections below]. The conditions below have been agreed between the applicant and the police.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. Digital CCTV and appropriate recording equipment will be installed and fully operational at all times the premises is in operation.
 - The system will be maintained and serviced at least once every 12 months.
 - The CCTV images will record and display dates and times, and these times will be checked regularly to ensure their accuracy.
 - The CCTV system will have sufficient storage capacity for 31 days evidential quality pictures.
 - The management will give full and immediate cooperation and technical assistance to the Police or authorised offices of Winchester City Council in the event that CCTV footage is required for the prevention and detection of suspected or alleged crime.
 - A member of staff must be present at all times who can operate the system and supply copies of these images on reasonable request to either Police, Council or other authorised Officer.
 - Subject to Data Protection guidance and legislation, the venue shall provide Police with a copy of CCTV within a reasonable time frame of the request being made.
 - All operators will receive training from the installer when equipment is installed and this training will be cascaded down to new members of staff.
- The licence holder must ensure that all staff selling alcohol have received adequate training, which must incorporate a process of assessment and refresher training to a recognised national standard on the law with regard to age restricted sales and that this has been properly documented and training records kept.

Protection of Children from Harm

- 1. The premises will operate a 'Challenge 25' or 'Think 25' policy
- 2. 'Challenge 25' or 'Think 25' messages shall be positioned clearly in any place that alcohol is displayed.
- 3. 'Challenge 25' or 'Think 25' messages shall be positioned clearly within all points of sale throughout the store.

6. Other Considerations

Community Strategy and Portfolio Plans (Relevance To:)

This report covers issues which affect the Outcomes of High Quality Environment and Active Communities.

There is no direct link to Portfolio Plans as the requirements under the Licensing Act 2003 are statutory functions.

Resource Implications

The application fee of £635 has been received. An annual fee of £350 is payable on the anniversary the licence was granted. In regulating the activities it is anticipated that an appropriate level of officer attendance will be provided within the existing budget.

There is a detailed staff training programme which ensures that comprehensive training is provided to employees having regard to their role and the responsibilities and such training is regularly refreshed and appropriate records kept.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises will have digital CCTV system that covers many areas of the shop floor, including the main area which will be used for display of alcohol.

Images will be retained for a minimum of 21 days and made available for inspection upon reasonable enforcement request.

Ordinarily, a member of the Management team will be on the premises all the time the store is open.

c) Public safety

The premises licence holder is fully aware of its responsibilities under a range of health and safety related legislation and has appropriate policies and procedures in place to be confident of complying with the relevant obligations which arise.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Employees are made aware of the need to have regard to the surrounding area and be aware of the needs of any local residents.

In addition, the company has a "good neighbour" policy which seeks to ensure that the premises play an active part in the local community.

Provision of Portable Fire-Fighting Equipment at Tesco Stores

General

Portable fire extinguishers are provided as a means of first eid fire fighting equipment but should not be considered for use on a large fire or as an aid to escape. Their portability and immediate availability allows for prompt intervention by an individual at the start of a fire.

Therefore the suitability and location will dictate the types and quantity of fire fighting equipment that is required

Suitability

Imprex Foam Extinguisher

The general purpose extinguisher deployed at Tesco stores is a 6 Litre foam (Imprex) exlinguisher. It can be used on solid carbonaceous fires (Class A) involving fuels such as timber, paper, plastic etc or on flammable liquid fires, such as petrol or cooking oil (Class B).

A simple formula is used to calculate the minimum number of general purpose (class A) and (class B) extinguishes that should be provided:

The pross floor area (metres) x 0.065 = Number Class A extinguishers required (rounded up)

(27 being the 'A' rating of the extinguisher)

Largest volume of splil of flammable liquid (litres) $\times 10^{-2}$ Number of Class B extinguishers

183*

(183 being the 'B' rating of the extinguisher)

Carbon Dioxide Extinguisher

These are provided by Tesco stores on fires involving live electric equipment. There is no guidance on the numbers required, however, due to widespread use of electrical equipment in Tesco stores, they are readily available in most areas

Additionally fire blankets are available in cooking areas.

Location

A person should not travel more than 30 metres to reach a suitable fire extinguisher from any point within the store, Additional extinguishers (above those needed to achieve an 'A' reting) may need to be provided to meet this requirement, but this is unlikely due to the layout of

Where possible, extinguishers are located adjacent to fire alarm call points (which in turn are adjacent to fire exits) forming a fire point, where the alarm can be raised and a decision made whether to attempt to tackle the fire or flee through the exit,



Limiting the hows that alcoholic beverages are available for fale might be a means of reducing excessive alcohol consumption and related harms.

Despite the fact that much of Winchester has been designated an Alcohol Control Zone for some years, alcehol misuse continues throughout the city, as well as in the centre - for example, on the Cathedral Green - and the associated behaviour creates concerns (for residents, Subinesses and visitors) about safety, public health and levels of cime.

Access to inexpensive alcohol from 7.00 an on the High Street may ensurage more incidences of anti-social behaviour in the historic city centre, as well as throughout a mider area, and could promote a damaging perception of Winchester as an unpleasant place to visit or inhabit.

Moderating increases in the physical availability of alcohol (i.e. number of outlets and times of sales) is arguably a sensible policy for influencing alcohol consumption and its related hams.

Availability of cheap, easily accessible alcohol, particularly during evening hours, would almost certainly increase the risk of numbers of people detrimentally affected by it and in need of Police and Ambulance attention. It is by no means difficult to witness situations, particularly on Friday and Saturday nights, when Police and Ambulance intervention is imperative as a result of excess alcohol consumption and any worsening would bring about further pressure to bear on already overstretched resources.

Those in decision making positions might well be advised to spend a Saturday night observing the streets of Winchester before reaching their final conclusion.


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Proposed License Conditions

- Digital CCTV and appropriate recording equipment will be installed and fully operational at all times the premises is in operation.
 - The system will be maintained and serviced at least once every 12 months.
 - The CCTV images will record and display dates and times, and these times will be checked regularly to ensure their accuracy.
 - The CCTV system will have sufficient storage capacity for 31 days evidential quality pictures.
 - The management will give full and immediate cooperation and technical assistance to the Police or authorised offices of Winchester City Council in the event that CCTV footage is required for the prevention and detection of suspected or alleged crime.
 - A member of staff must be present at all times who can operate the system and supply copies of these images on reasonable request to either Police, Council or other authorised Officer.
 - Subject to Data Protection guidance and legislation, the venue shall provide Police with a copy of CCTV within a reasonable time frame of the request being made.
 - All operators will receive training from the installer when equipment is installed and this training will be cascaded down to new members of staff.
- 2. The licence holder must ensure that all staff selling alcohol have received adequate training, which must incorporate a process of assessment and refresher training to a recognised national standard on the law with regard to age restricted sales and that this has been properly documented and training records kept.
- 3. Any person appearing to those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 25 and who is attempting to buy alcohol will be required to produce satisfactory photographic identification as proof of age. Acceptable ID shall be as per the current guidance from either the DCMS or the Home Office.
- 4. The premises will operate a 'Challenge 25' or 'Think 25' policy
- 5. 'Challenge 25' or 'Think 25' messages shall be positioned clearly in any place that alcohol is displayed.
- 6. 'Challenge 25' or 'Think 25' messages shall be positioned clearly within all points of sale throughout the store.
