# REPORT OF THE HEAD OF LANDSCAPE AND OPEN SPACES

#### DETAIL:

- 1. TPO 2015 Suncroft Lower Road South Wonston Winchester
- 1.1 Winchester City Council had been approached about a potential development on the site.
- 1.2 The Arboricultural Officer attended site to assess the trees and determined:
  - That the trees provided significant visual amenity; and
  - That the removal of the trees or undertaking of works may result in unnecessary and avoidable damage to the trees and amenity
- 1.3 Thus, the criteria for a Tree Preservation Order was met and a TPO was made on 24 September 2010.
- 1.4 The grounds for making the order were that these were: "Significant trees that contributes to the visual amenity of the area."

# Formal Objection

- 1.5 An objection has been received on behalf of the land owner
- 1.6 The objection stated, in summary:
  - Object on the grounds of victimisation and that the trees do not warrant a Tree Preservation Order being placed on the property.
  - The Council's letter refers to the likelihood of a planning application being made but, if so, why was there never a TPO placed on the property in 1991 and 2001 when planning applications for a house were submitted.
  - The belief that the TPO was not served properly.

# Officer Comments

1.7 The tree has been assessed using the Tree Evaluation Method for Tree Preservation Orders (TEMPO) and the visual observations of the arboricultural officer. TEMPO is a nationally recognised tool for assessing trees for suitability for TPO and is recommended for use by the Winchester City Council Tree Strategy – consultation draft. It is based on 5 factors:

amenity assessment, retention span, relative public visibility and suitability for TPO, other factors and expediency assessment.

- 1.8 The trees scored well given their condition and suitability, retention span, public visibility and expediency assessment and on the decision guide under part 3 of the assessment it states for the score it received of 11/25 'TPO Defensible'.
- 1.9 In response to the objection, the Arboricultural Officer has observed that:
  - These are significant trees in full view from a public open space at Pine Close and Lower Road Track, which is a well-used Restricted Bridleway.

Any potential future development of this site would require an arboricultural impact assessment and method statement in accordance with BS5837:2005.

- With regard to the concerns that a TPO was not made when previous applications were submitted, this has no bearing on the current situation. The need for a TPO is considered on a case by case basis at the time it is made.
- In the South Wonston Village Plan it states:

Under section 9.5. Features to be preserved 73% of the people surveyed wanted Trees and Hedges protected

Officers are satisfied that the TPO was properly served


