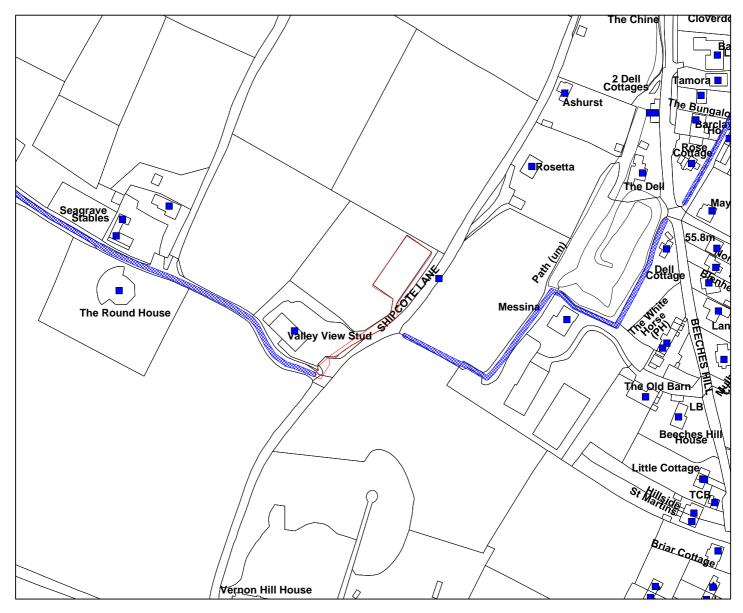

General Comments

This application is reported to the Committee because of the number of supporting representations received.

Site Description

The site comprises an area of land measuring approximately 3.6 hectares, situated in the countryside approximately half a mile to the north of the settlement boundary of Bishops Waltham and is within the South Downs National Park.

The site is in equestrian use (a manège), and includes an American barn containing nine loose boxes sited to the south of the site with the manège to the west of the site, with the remaining land being sectioned by post and rail fencing. It is enclosed by hedgerow and shrubbery to the eastern and northern boundaries, with the southern and western boundaries being enclosed by hedgerows, mature trees and shrubbery. The site is in an elevated position, with the land gently sloping away in a southerly direction. There is a close boarded fence, approximately 2m in height, which runs around the north east and north west boundary of the manège.

Proposal

The proposal seeks to retain 6 floodlights to the manège.

06/02063/FUL: Change of use of land to equestrian; erection of stable block with tack room and office - Withdrawn 7th August 2006.

07/00022/FUL: Erection of 9 stables, hay store and tack room and change of use of land to equestrian use - Permitted 14th March 2007.

08/01448/FUL: Construction of manège (part retrospective) - Permitted 29th October 2008.

09/01228/FUL: Variation of Conditions 5 and 6 of planning permission ref: 07/00022/FUL

(Change of use of land and buildings to a mixed use of livery and commercial horse breeding and training purposes) - Permitted 26th October 2009.

10/00159/FUL: Retention of floodlighting to manège (retrospective) - Withdrawn 28th April 2010.

Consultations

Landscape Team:

As the site is elevated, with clear and long ranging views eastwards over the National Park, there is a concern that visual impact from the 'sky glow' that would be produced is unacceptable in what should be an "intrinsically dark landscape".

South Downs National Park:

The loss of dark night skies through light pollution is a key issue identified in the statutory South Downs Management Plan, adopted and endorsed by your Council, and Policy 3.1 is to ensure that no developments adversely affect the dark night skies of the South Downs. Accordingly, the SDNP objects to the proposals and asks that the Council takes action to secure the removal of the lights.

Environmental Protection Team:

No adverse comments to make regarding this application.

<u>HCC Ecology</u>: At this site, due to the location and as the manège is set back from the existing hedgerow/treeline, there is no particular concern about the lighting proposed.

HCC Public Rights of Way:

No comments.

Representations:

<u>Bishops Waltham Parish Council:</u> Objects, for the following reasons (see attached referral request):

- This application is contrary to Policy DP3, in that the proposal would have an unacceptable adverse impact on the neighbouring properties.
- The proposal would also have an unacceptable adverse impact on the setting of the South Downs National Park.

<u>7 representations received objecting to the application,</u> on the grounds that the proposal will result in intrusive lighting in the South Downs National Park.

<u>6 representations received supporting the application</u>, on the grounds that the floodlighting is required for the type of livery offered at the site.

Planning Considerations

Principle of development Impact on character of area and neighbouring properties

Principle of development

Policy RT11 of the Winchester District Local Plan allows for equestrian development in the countryside, providing it does not have an adverse effect upon the appearance of the landscape by the use of inappropriate construction materials, boundary treatments, floodlighting and other infrastructure. It is considered that, given the prominent location of the manège on this elevated site within the South Downs National Park, the use of floodlighting on this particular site is not acceptable, due to the consequent incongruous visual intrusion within an area of countryside that is otherwise naturally dark, particularly during winter months.

Impact on character of area and neighbouring property

The manège which relates to this application received planning permission in October 2008 (ref: 08/01448/FUL), and planning conditions required that it be used solely by the horses stabled on site and that there be no freestanding or fixed floodlighting. The purpose of the imposition of the floodlighting condition was to ensure that the intrinsically dark landscape was not compromised by the illumination of the manège. Further to a site visit undertaken in the dark hours of a clear evening, the site was observed from both within the manège and from distant views. The site was clearly visible from distant views and light spill into the night sky, albeit at a relatively low level, was observed. It is considered that, on an evening where there was low cloud or mist, the halo effect created from the floodlighting would be greatly exacerbated and would result in a prominent and unwelcome feature in the night sky. It is therefore considered that the proposal is detrimental to the South Downs National Park and to the outlook of neighbouring residential properties.

Recommendation

Application Refused, for the following reason:

1. The proposal, by reason of illumination, introduces an unduly prominent and obtrusive feature located on an elevated position that would be detrimental to the visual amenities of this sensitive area of the South Downs National Park and detract from the visual and general amenities of the occupiers of nearby residential properties, and is therefore contrary to Policies DP3, RT11 and CE28 of the Winchester District Local Plan Review 2006 and Policies C2 and C4 of the South East Plan 2009.
