# TREE PRESERVATION ORDER 2006 – LAND AT NEWLANDS, HILL POUND, SWANMORE

#### REPORT OF THE HEAD OF OPEN SPACE AND LANDSCAPE

#### DETAIL:

- 1. TPO 2006 Land adjacent to Newlands, Hill Pound, Swanmore
- 1.1 Winchester City Council received a call from a member of public stating that they believed these trees to be under threat from development.
- 1.2 In the arboricultural officer's absence, an area TPO was made and served on 23rd June 2010.
- 1.3 The grounds for making the order were that these were: "Significant trees that contribute to the visual amenity of the area."
- 1.4 There have been two objections on the grounds that:
  - Poor quality trees included in the order the majority of the trees within the area are either small in size, with limited visual amenity and/or in poor condition with little prospect of long term retention as useful trees.
  - Use of the area order designation area order should be used only in emergencies and amended where appropriate.
  - Tree related health and safety issues a number of trees within the area have clear structural defects and other arboricultural deficiencies.
- 1.5 There have been 43 letters of support for making the TPO from local residents on the grounds that:
  - The loss of these trees may open opportunities for neighbouring properties to do the same, resulting in significant tree loss in the area.
  - The trees provide local wildlife with food source, particularly bats.
  - The trees to the rear are of great importance and contribute to the character of the area.
  - The trees provide significant noise and windbreak protection.

#### Officer Comments

1.6 The trees have been assessed using a combination of the arboricultural officer's experience and visual observations and the Tree Evaluation Method for Tree Preservation Orders (TEMPO). TEMPO is a nationally recognised tool for assessing trees for suitability for TPO and is recommended for use by the Winchester City Council Tree Strategy – consultation draft.

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- 1.7 It was decided that the most suitable course of action to be taken would be to confirm the order with amendments to include just the Hawthorn, Cherry and Holly trees to the rear of the site. This would remove the area order designation and those that are not considered worthy of protection.
- 1.8 These trees scored highly given their visual amenity value and prominence in the landscape, which placed them in the category 'TPO Defensible' on the survey data sheet and decision guide.
- 1.9 In response to the objection, the arboricultural officer's report stated that:
  - By amending the TPO to include just the native trees to the rear of the garden, the poor quality trees and those with health and safety issues would no longer be protected.
- 1.10 The tree officer would be happy to meet with an applicant onsite to discuss appropriate work to the trees and to provide guidance on submitting a formal application.


