EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

To consider the confirmation of Tree Preservation Order 2133, to which one objection has been raised.

RECOMMENDATION:

That, having taken into consideration the representation received, Tree Preservation Order 2133 be confirmed.

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DETAIL:

- 1.1 The Council received a request to protect trees on the above site that were at risk of removal from a new owner.
- 1.2 The Tree Officer attended the site to assess the trees and determined:
 - That a number of the trees onsite were highly visible from the public domain and provided significant visual amenity.
 - Their removal would have a detrimental impact on local amenity.
- 1.3 In the circumstances therefore it was considered expedient to make a Tree Preservation Order (TPO), because the trees were significant and contributed to the local amenity of the area.
- 1.4 TPO 2109 was served as an area order on 1 May 2014.
- 1.5 An objection was received on this order from the then owner of the site. The tree officer then visited the site to identify specific trees to include in the order with a view of satisfying the then owner of the site so the objection could be withdrawn. At this time, the site was sold so it was considered appropriate to allow this order to lapse and serve a new order with the new trees to allow the new owners to comment on the order.
- 1.6 TPO 2133 was served on 24 October 2014.

Formal Objections

- 1.7 One objection to the TPO has been received from the owner of the site
- 1.8 The objection stated:
 - The land has been left for some years and is in need of attention.
 - T2 is leaning and concerns are raised over its stability and safety.
 - T6, T7, T8 and T9 are adjacent to the main road and concerns are raised over their stability and potential impact on the highway.
 - T9 is close to the property and will require pruning.
 - T4 is particularly large and in a location intended for enhancing the small orchard. It is intended for this tree to be removed.
 - The objector has also requested a full written report from a qualified arboriculturalist to ascertain the safety and condition of all the trees under this order.

Officer Comments

- 1.9 In response to the public representation, the Tree Officer advises that:
 - The trees are highly visible from the public domain and make a significant contribution to local amenity.
 - It is the owner's responsibility to ascertain the safety and condition of the trees onsite and should any works become necessary, an application may be submitted to the Council. It is not the Council's intention to prevent necessary works from being carried out
- 1.10 Notwithstanding the objection, it is recommended that Tree Preservation Order 2133 is confirmed.
