1. APPOINTMENT OF VICE CHAIRMAN FOR THE 2016/17 MUNICIPAL YEAR

The Committee noted that, in accordance with the Council's Constitution, in the absence of Councillor Learney, Councillor Stallard would be unable to assume the Chair as she was a member of the party which currently formed the Council's Cabinet. Therefore, if Councillor Learney was unable to attend a future meeting, the Committee agreed that it would appoint a new, temporary, Chairman for that meeting only.

RESOLVED:

That Councillor Stallard be appointed Vice-Chairman for the 2016/17 Municipal Year.

2. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

Councillors Huxstep and Stallard each declared a disclosable pecuniary interest in respect of agenda items due to their role as County Councillors. Councillor Thacker, whose husband was a County Councillor, also made a similar declaration. However, as there was no material conflict of interest, they remained in the room, spoke and voted under the dispensation granted on behalf of the Standards Committee to participate and vote on all matters which might have a County Council involvement.

3. FUTURE MEETING DATES AND TIMES

Councillor Godfrey drew attention to a recent change to the February 2017 Council meeting date, which he stated may also affect the 13 February 2017 Committee meeting date. In response, the Committee considered that this matter could be reviewed at a later date.

3. That the following Informal Scrutiny Group (ISG) be established and appointments be made to ISGs:

i. Performance Management ISG (previously referred to as Covalent Performance Management Software ISG): (maximum seven appts) Councillors Stallard (Chairman), Huxstep, Gemmell, Griffiths and three nominations from the Liberal Democrat Group to be advised.

6. <u>SCRUTINY WORK PROGRAMME AND JULY 2016 FORWARD PLAN</u> (Report OS146 refers)

The Committee referred to the work programme which would continue to be updated to reflect other business coming forward throughout the 2016/17 Municipal Year. It was noted that action that was required following work undertaken by previous Chairman, former Councillor Simon Cook, to investigate the role of scrutiny and establish a 'Review of Scrutiny ISG'. The Chief Executive considered that an initial meeting with the newly appointed ISG leads would be arranged in due course to discuss this matter further, with input from the respective Groups.

Councillor Godfrey requested that the Committee take active steps towards the formation of the ISG at the earliest opportunity, so to progress the relevant aspects of the Independent Review response. In particular, he drew Members' attention that the Scrutiny function could be the driver for continuous improvement. In conclusion, Councillor Godfrey stated that it would be beneficial to report the progress made by the Committee on this matter to the

next meeting of the Independent Review Informal Policy Group scheduled to take place on 16 June 2016.

In response to questions regarding the work of the River Park Leisure Centre ISG, the Chief Executive explained that this ISG was a 'task and finish' group that had finished its business in its current form. However, the Committee could consider establishing a new ISG to look at the current position in relation to the Leisure Centre should the Committee wish to undertake some pre-scrutiny policy work in terms of how to take this matter forward.

That the Scrutiny Work Programme and Forward Plan for June 2016 be noted.
