What is the Evening Economy?

- Eating and drinking (pubs, restaurants, takeaways)
- Leisure and culture (cinema, theatre, festivals)
- Shopping (late openings)

... greater emphasis on alcohol as the evening turns to night-time



Challenges of the Night Time Economy

- alcohol and drug abuse
- anti-social behaviour
- damage to street scene and facilities
- increased fear of crime
- limited public transport
- fall out



Opportunities of the Evening Economy

- new opportunities for local businesses (direct and indirect)
- more vibrant town centre
- summertime café culture
- easing the evening rush hour
- making public transport more viable

- Early Evening Economy Framework
- PubWatch initiatives/Alcohol control zone
- CCTV upgrade
- Continental Shifts/First Thursdays
- Additional PCSO/Police support
- Marketing the city as an evening destination




Purple Flag
