WINCHESTER LITTER BIN PROVISION- UPDATE REPORT

REPORT OF ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (NEIGHBOURHOODS & ENVIRONMENT)

Report WTF 192 – Litter Bin Provision 11th September 2013

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Town Forum received a previous report on the litter bin provision within Winchester in September 2013 (report WTF 192 refers) following representation from the Winchester Litter Pickers (WILPs) Group with suggestions of possible locations for additional bins

Because of the size of the list of suggested locations an initial audit was carried out at that time to establish the level of need and to review street cleaning schedules. Forum were advised that further audits would be carried out to assess the situation during different 'loadings' on the areas due to school terms and shopping patterns. Discussions were also held with WILPs who usefully reviewed and prioritised their suggestions as it was recognised that there was insufficient resources to provide bins in all of the locations.

All of this work has now been completed and this report is able to provide the final conclusions of the Neighbourhood Support Officers who have led on this project and provides a recommended way forward. Appendix A is taken from the original report WTF 192 and is reproduced and updated so that Members can clearly identify the final conclusion for each site.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Winchester Town Forum:

- 1. Notes the final conclusions on the proposed litter bin sites suggested by the Winchester Litter Pickers Group.
- 2. Thanks the Winchester Litter Pickers Group for their assistance with this work and for their on-going contribution towards the upkeep of the environment of the City.

- 2.1 The effective maintenance of the street scene is a key element of the High Quality Environment priority of the existing Community Strategy. It also supports the work to provide an enhanced approach to neighbourhood management across the District.
- 3 **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**:
- 4.1 The final recommendations are for the installation of 5 additional litter bins and for 6 existing dog waste bins to be replaced with dual use bins as set out in the appendix to this report.
- 4.2 Because of the small numbers involved when compared to the existing network of bins the installation cost of this work can be met from within the existing street care and street cleansing budgets as part of the routine on-going bin provision and replacement programme. Some of the costs can also be met from budgets provided for the replacement of dog waste bins with dual as described in report WTF 192.
- 4.3 There are therefore no resource implications to Forum from the recommendations within this report. If Members of Forum wish to expand the list of bins provided then a further report would need to be provided as additional resources may be required by the contractor to service an expanded network of bins.
