CONFIRMATION OF TREE PRESERVATION ORDER 2121 – LAND AT THE RECREATION GROUND, WICKHAM

REPORT OF THE HEAD OF LANDSCAPE AND OPEN SPACES

DETAIL:

- 1. TPO 2121 LAND AT THE RECREATION GROUND, WICKHAM
- 1.1 The trees in question are located on the edge of the recreation ground in Wickham. The TPO protects two Oak, one Beech and one Sweet Chestnut.
- 1.2 A request was received to protect the trees in this area due to pressures from adjacent property owners to fell or prune the trees.
- 1.3 The Tree Officer attended the site to assess the trees and determined:
 - That the trees were highly visible from the public domain and provided significant visual amenity.
 - Their removal would have a detrimental impact on local amenity.
- 1.4 TPO 2121 was served on 28th July 2014.

Formal Objections

- 1.5 One objection to the TPO has been received from a neighbouring property.
- 1.6 The objection stated:
 - T2 is located less than 10m from the objector's house and only a few inches from an adjacent brick wall. The wall is being undermined, making it unsafe for users of the right of way. The roots have the potential to interfere with the foundations of the house.
 - It is a young tree and the majority of the canopy overhangs the objector's garden and will do so more as it increases in size.
 - Should the tree fall, it would hit the house and could harm the occupants. It already leans toward the house.

Officer Comments

- 1.7 In response to the public representation, the Tree Officer advises that:
 - No evidence has been submitted to the Council to indicate that the tree is causing damage to property, or likely to in the future.
 - No evidence has been submitted to the Council to indicate that the tree is unsafe or in poor health or condition.

 Should an application for tree work be submitted, the Council would consider the works requested along with any supporting evidence.

- The trees are highly visible from the public domain as described above, and make a significant contribution to local amenity.
- 1.8 Notwithstanding the objection therefore it is recommended that Tree Preservation Order 2121 is confirmed.


