## Addendum to Report WTF153

## Shortlist of Non-Profit Organisations for Funding 2011/12

The report WTF153 sets out the context of the decision to suspend the community grants programme in the autumn of last year which was one of uncertainty about whether funds could be made available for any community grants for 2011/12.

Paragraph 1.4 (b) explains that some organisations (other than key clients) were identified as being very important for delivering Community Strategy priorities over 2011/12.

The process for identifying these organisations was as follows. On 9 November Cllr Dominic Hiscock, Cllr Lucille Thompson and Cllr Kelsie Learney met with officers to review the list of organisations funded through the community revenue grants budget in 2010/11. They discussed the role played by each organisation and their relevance to the Community Strategy priorities. These are:-

- Improve the wellbeing of older people
- Improve access to services
- Reduce the district's carbon footprint
- Stanmore
- Winnall

At the meeting Members indicated that they wished officers to discuss with particularly relevant organisations whether they would be able to contribute towards priorities in 2011/12 and, if so, to invite them to put in an application for revenue funding (albeit a smaller amount). These organisations are as follows:-

- Age Concern (Winchester) older people
- The Carroll Centre Stanmore
- Homestart (Winchester) access to services, Stanmore, Winnall
- Stanmore Combined (Stanmore)
- Winnall Rock School Winnall
- Winnall Junior Youth Club Winnall
- Winnall Community Association Winnall
- Winnall Live at Home Scheme Winnall
- Hampshire and Isle of Wight Youth Options (King Alfred Youth Activity Centre) - Winnall
- Winchester Churches Night Shelter access to services
- Young Carers access to services
- Winchester Detached Youth Project access to services

Homestart (Meon Valley) – access to services

(NB Funding for Winchester Action on Climate Change (WinACC) was not made from the community grants budget but from a separate budget line following a decision to fund the organisation for its first 3 years. WinACC was therefore not included in these discussions).

As mentioned in the report, Cabinet on 9 February will recommend the sum of next year's community revenue grants budget to Council. Cabinet in March will then determine the individual allocations.
