

<u>Update</u>

A further 7 representations have been received objecting to the revised plans for the following reasons:

- Amendments are so minimal they will have no meaningful effect on the size and mass of the proposed building.
- Only a 15m² (5%) reduction in footprint.
- Garage lowered in height and moved closer to dwelling- overall effect is that the garage and house will appear as an integral entity.
- Garage floor area is 65m²- makes the overall development 345m² compared to approx. 200m² of Complyns.
- Site plan shows Complyns larger than it actually is.
- Scale of proposed house dominates listed property.
- Proposal would clutter the landscape and introduce a suburban feel to a South Downs hamlet.
- Appears to be little material difference with the revised design.
- Policy SD25 is an important material consideration and must be weighed in the balance when reaching a decision.
- There have been no objections to Policy SD25 thus considerable weight should now be given to this fundamental change, placing Chilcomb in the countryside where a need has to be established for any new housing.
- Joint Core Strategy policies cannot automatically take precedence.

Update

Alternative planting scheme

The applicants have already submitted a proposed planting scheme comprising a 7m run of hornbeam hedging along the north fence line between the existing willow tree and existing elder tree and a further 7.5m run of hedging between the existing elder and where High View's land joins Fonthill House.

As an alternative, the applicants have also suggested two species of trees, planted as mature specimens. The suggestion would be two trees with a narrow crown planted either side of the existing elder on the north boundary with High View and Fonthill House which would provide screening without creating undue shadows to the north. Such semi-mature species would help to screen the development from the neighbouring property High View.

Final details of the planting can be secured via the recommended landscaping condition.

Update

1. Supplementary consultation response from Head of Environment al Health:

Recommend following condition:

Prior to the commencement of the operation, a comprehensive 'Manure and Odour Management Plan' shall be submitted and approved in writing to the Local Planning Authority. The Plan shall comply with the relevant best practice set out in the Environment Agency's EPR 6.09 Sector Guidance Note 'How to comply with your environmental permit for intensive farming'. The plan as approved shall be implemented and complied with thereafter.'

Reason: To protect the amenity for persons living, working and enjoying the facility.

issues

Air Quality (particulates)

Having regard to DEFRA research which shows particulates from poultry houses fall off to background levels beyond 100m, the distance of 25km from the edge of the Winchester AQMA and the fact that particulates from vehicle emissions will significantly outweigh those from the facility there will not be a measurable impact on Winchester's air quality from this operation. However the Head of Environmental Health considers the applicant should comply with the Environment Agency Guidance Note EPR 6.09 'How to Comply with your environmental permit for intensive farming.'

Air Quality (odour)

Findings of odour assessment accepted in relation to manure removed but consideration not given to impact of stockpiling and there are uncertainties relating to quantities of manure involved therefore condition recommended.

Insect Control

Increase in flies inevitable but as a statutory nuisance can be controlled through EH legislation but best practice could be required through the implementation of a

Manure Management Plan submitted prior to commencement of the operation.

Noise

This issue has been previously addressed in the EH initial consultation. Level of traffic generation would be minimal.

Ammonia Emission

Natural England as statutory Consultee are best placed to comment.

2. Further to the recommendation of the Head of Environment al Health replace condition 9 on the report with the above condition and add the following reason to address all sensitive receptors

Reason: To minimise the impact of the storage of chicken droppings on sensitive receptors to comply with Policy CP16 of the Winchester District local Plan Part 1 and Policy DM17, DM19 and DM24 of the Winchester District Local Plan Part 2.
