

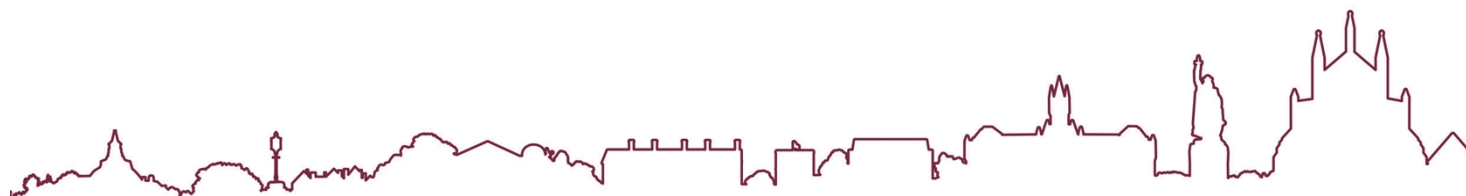

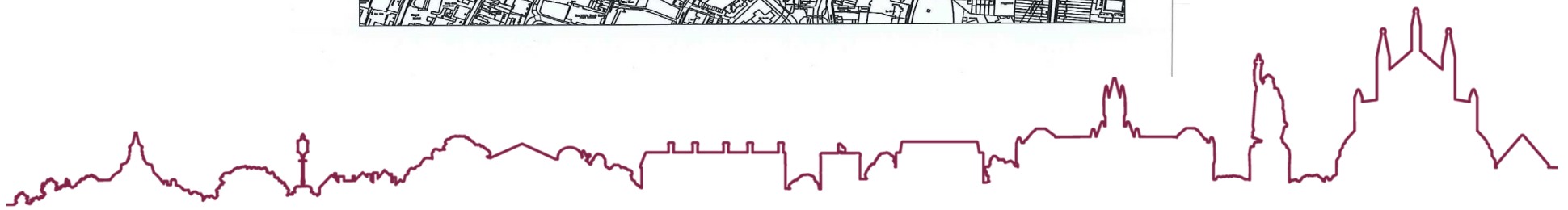
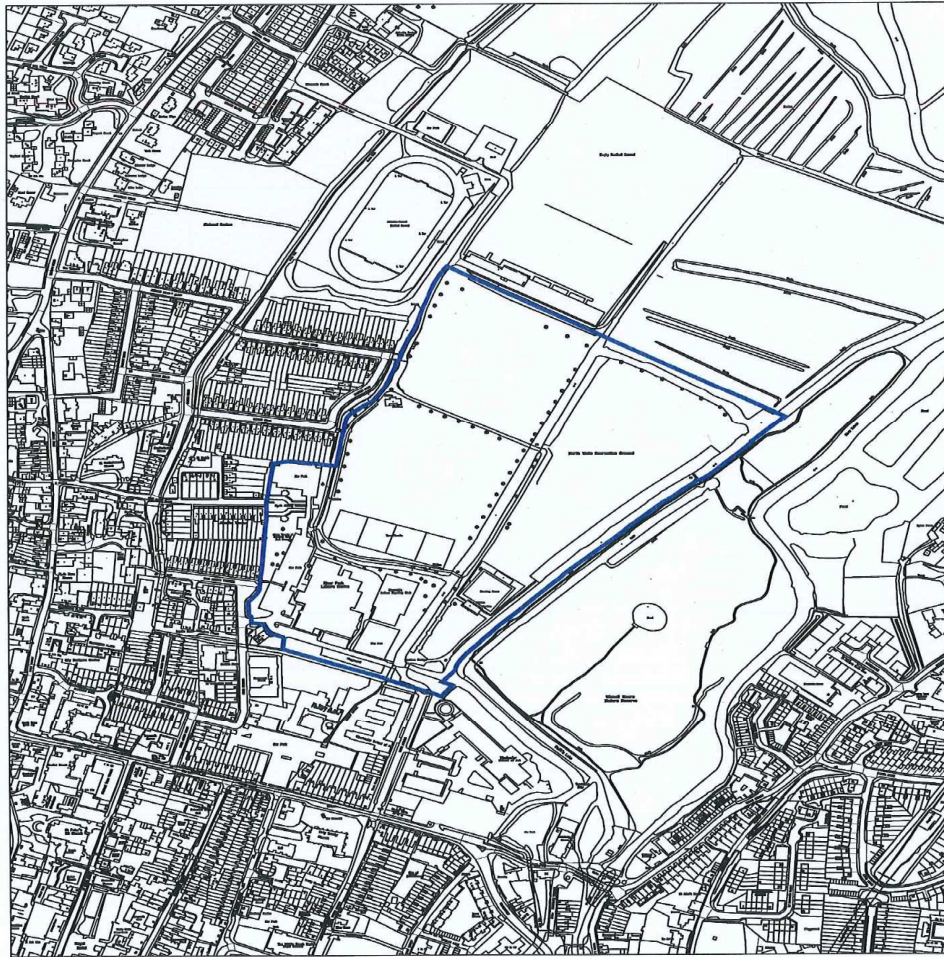

THE ENGAGEMENT EVENT

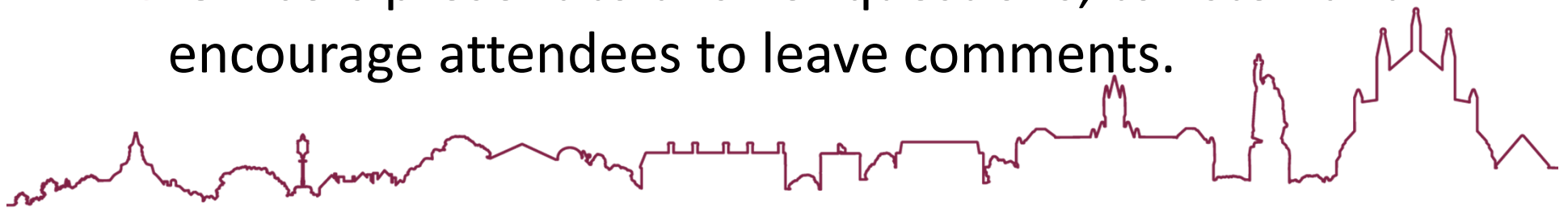
 Held on Friday 22nd and Saturday 23rd March 2019 on North Walls open space.

FEEDBACK FROM THE ENGAGEMENT EVENT

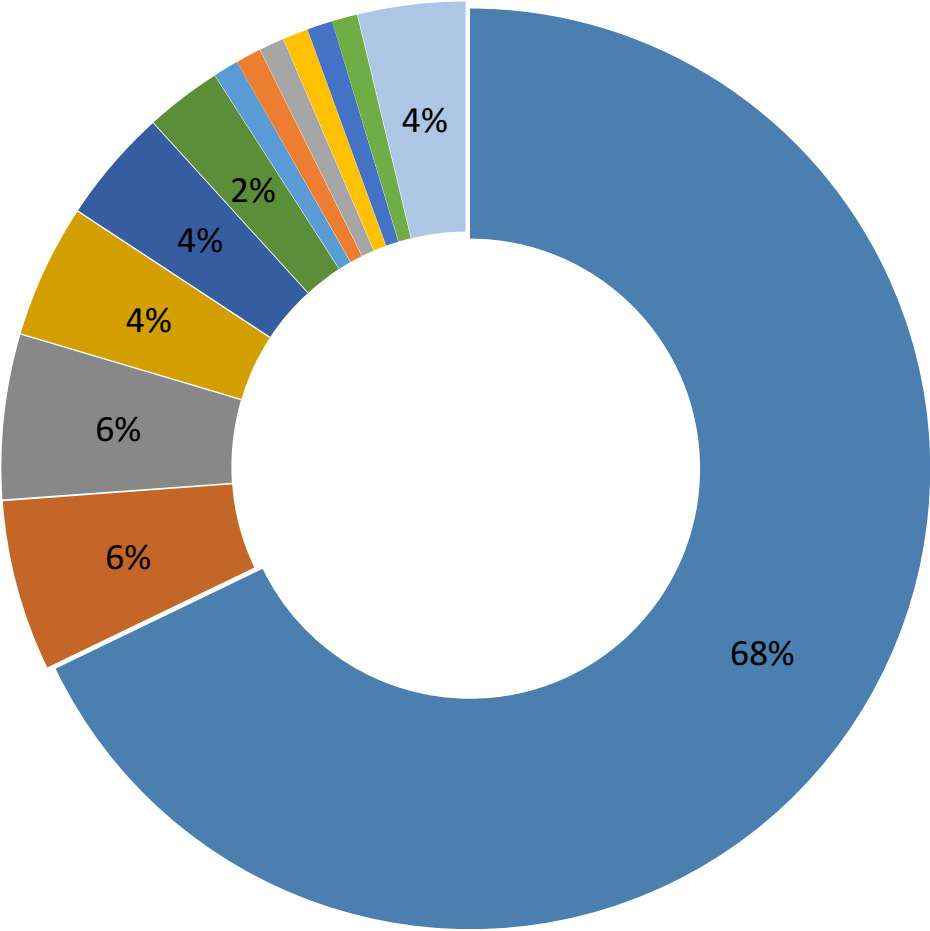
 The event was attended by over 800 people over 2 days.

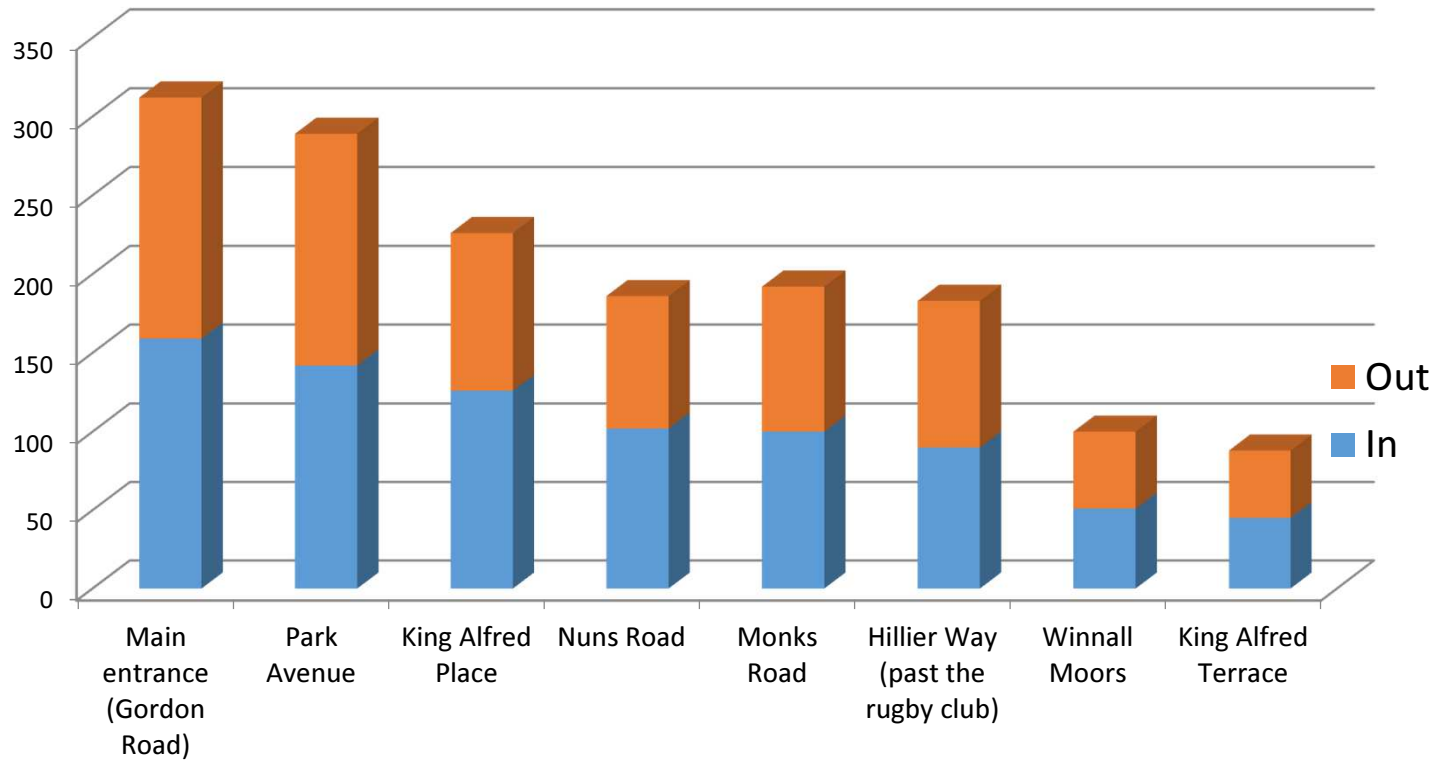

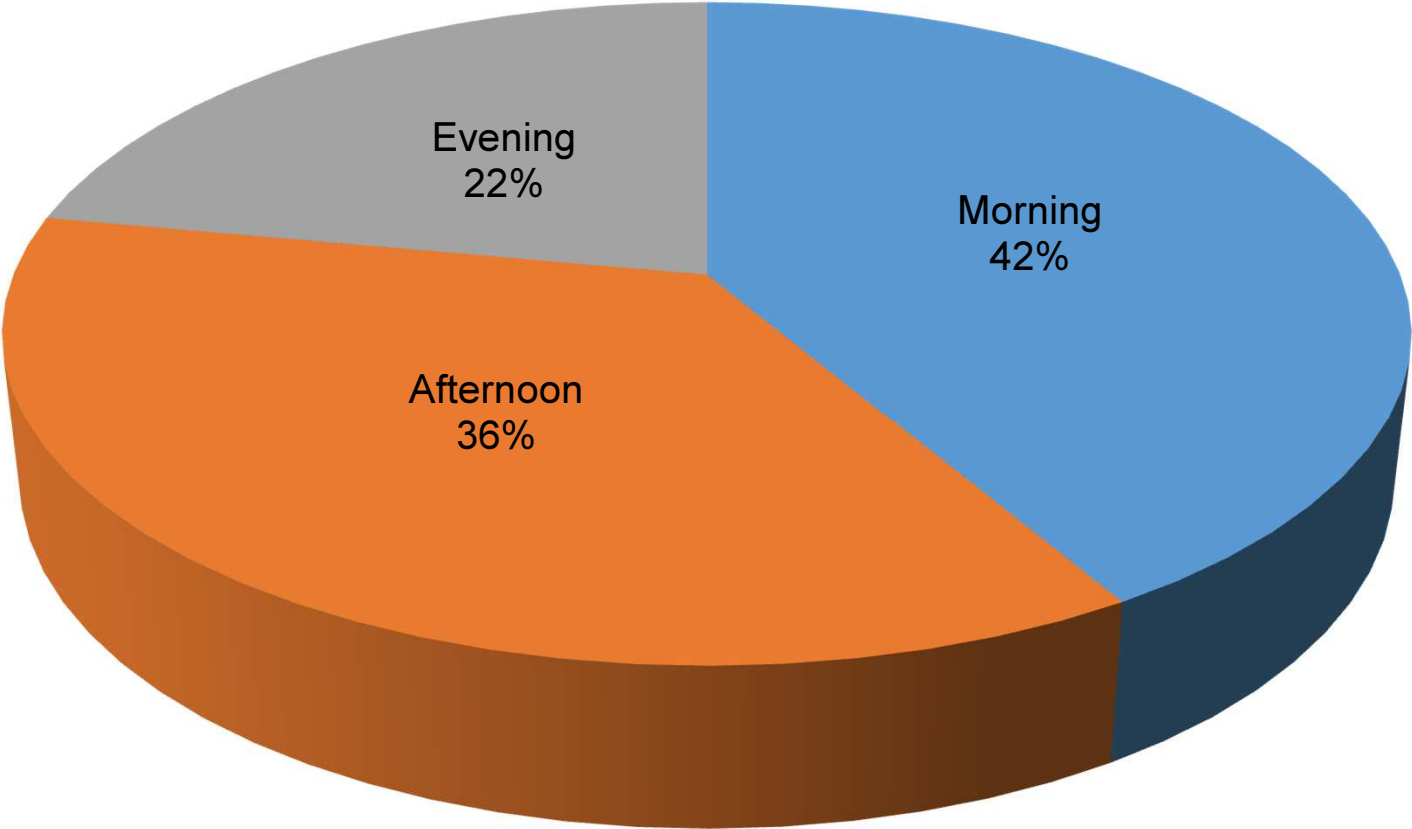


RESULTS – WHICH ENTRANCES TO THE RECREATION GROUND DO YOU USE?

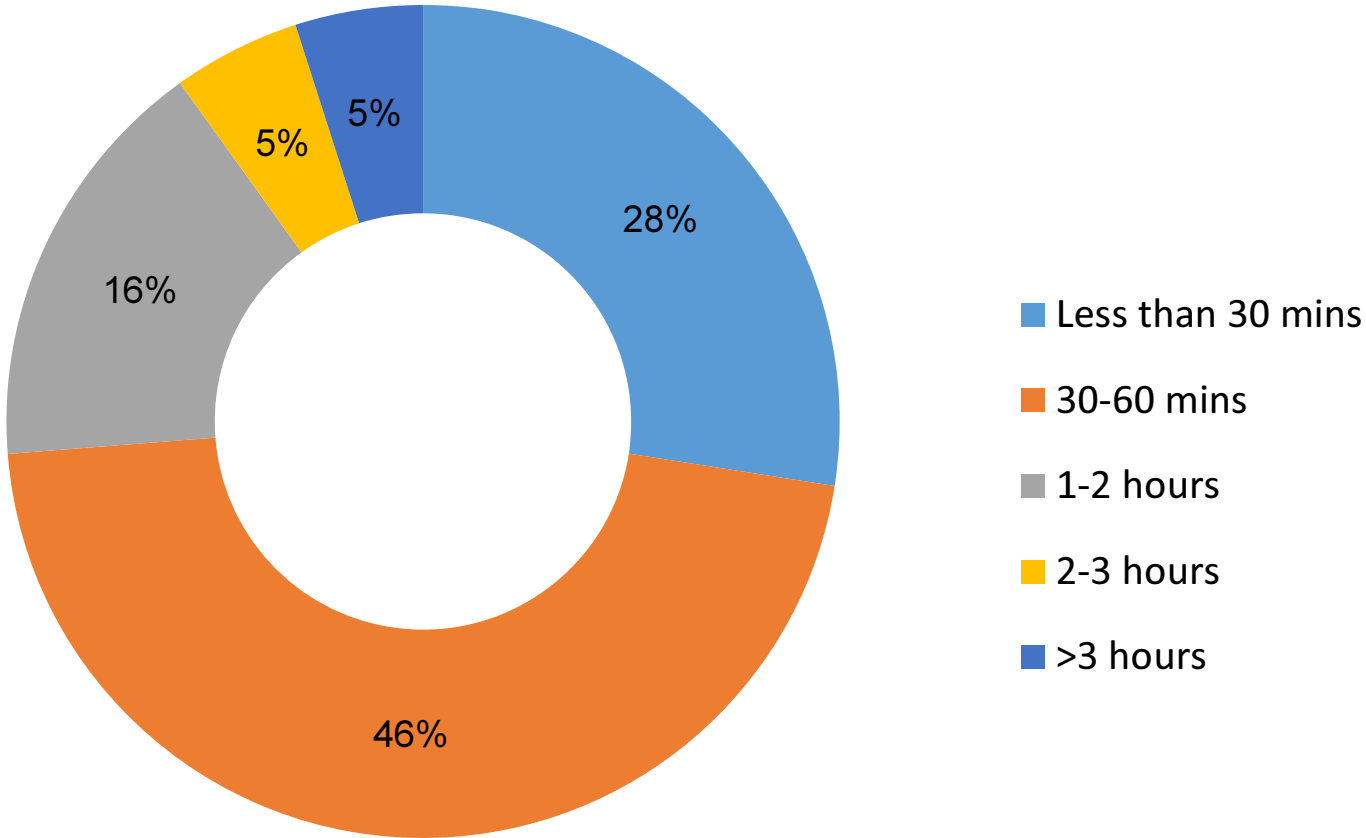

RESULT – AVERAGE LENGTH OF EACH VISIT

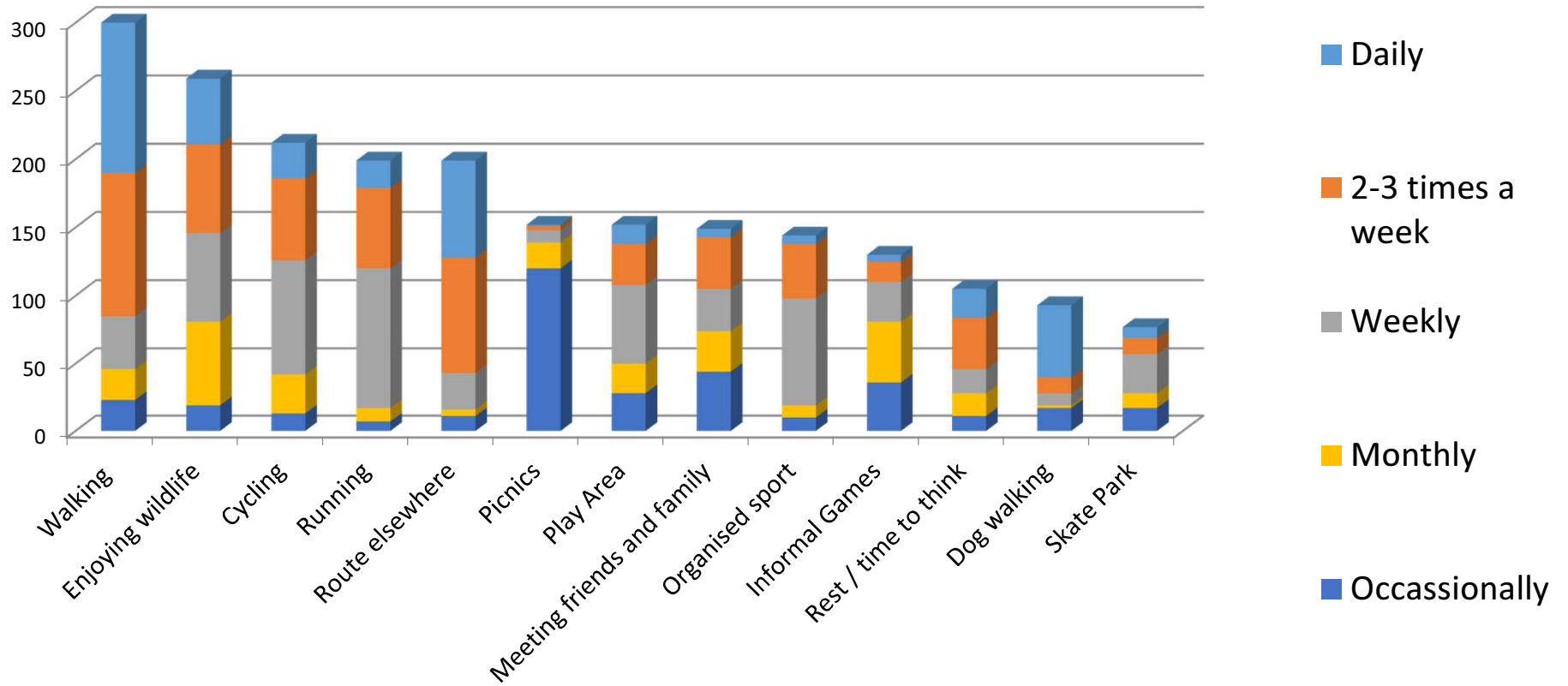

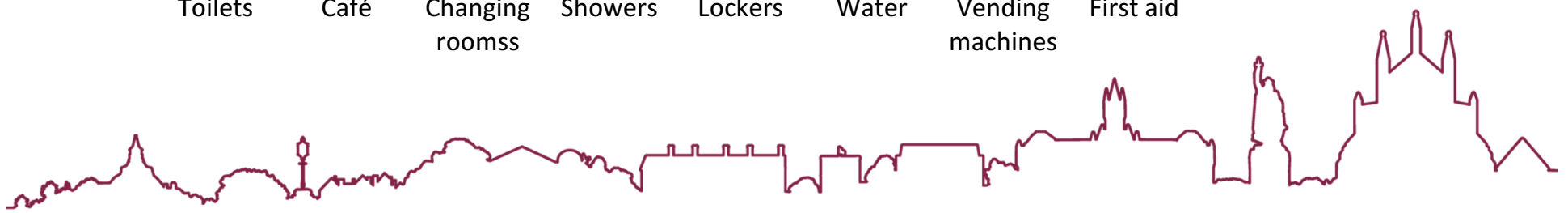
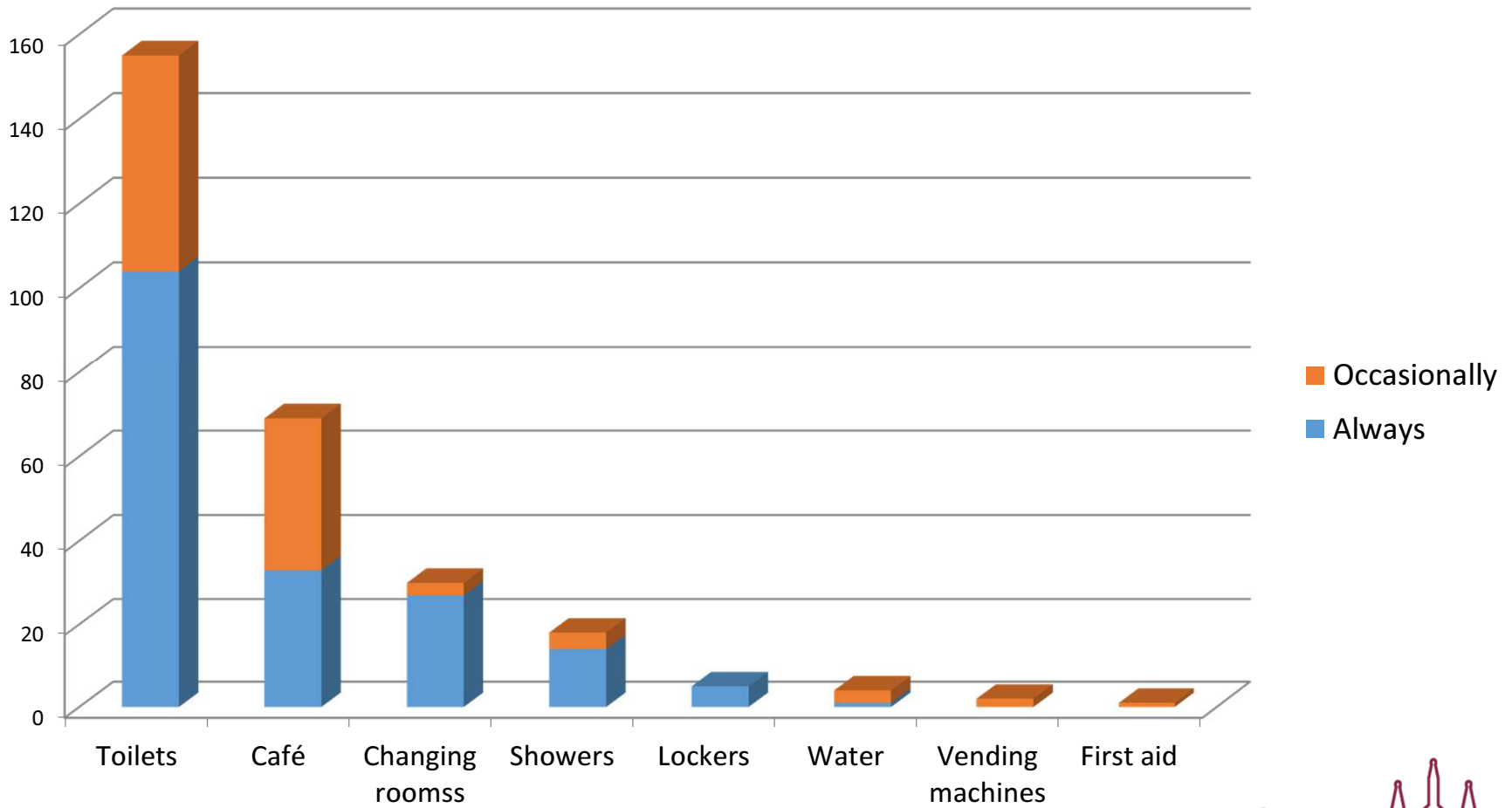
RESULTS – WHAT ACTIVITIES DO YOU ENJOY AT NORTH WALLS

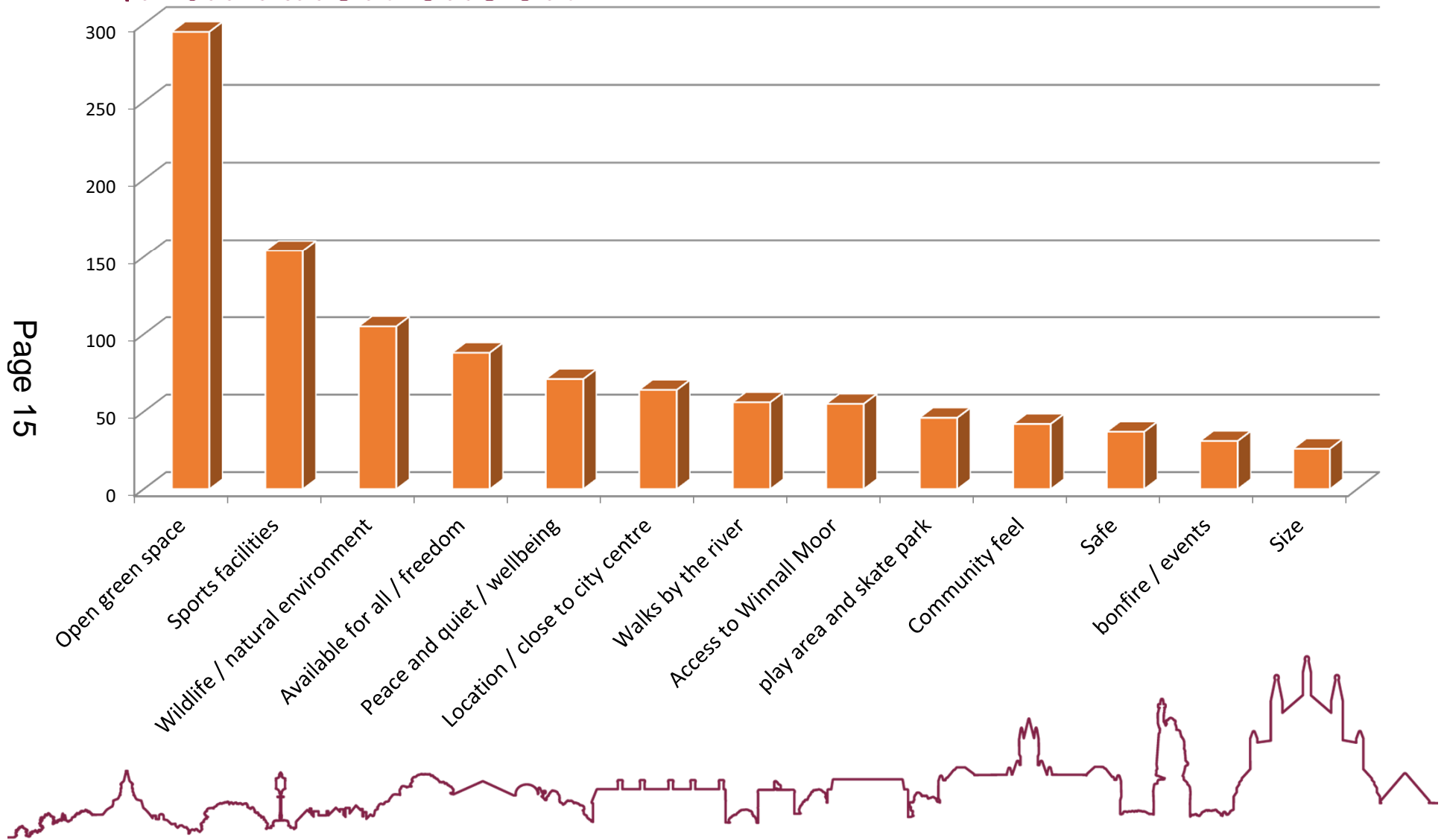
RESULTS – FACILITIES ACCESSED WHEN USING NORTH WALLS OPEN SPACE

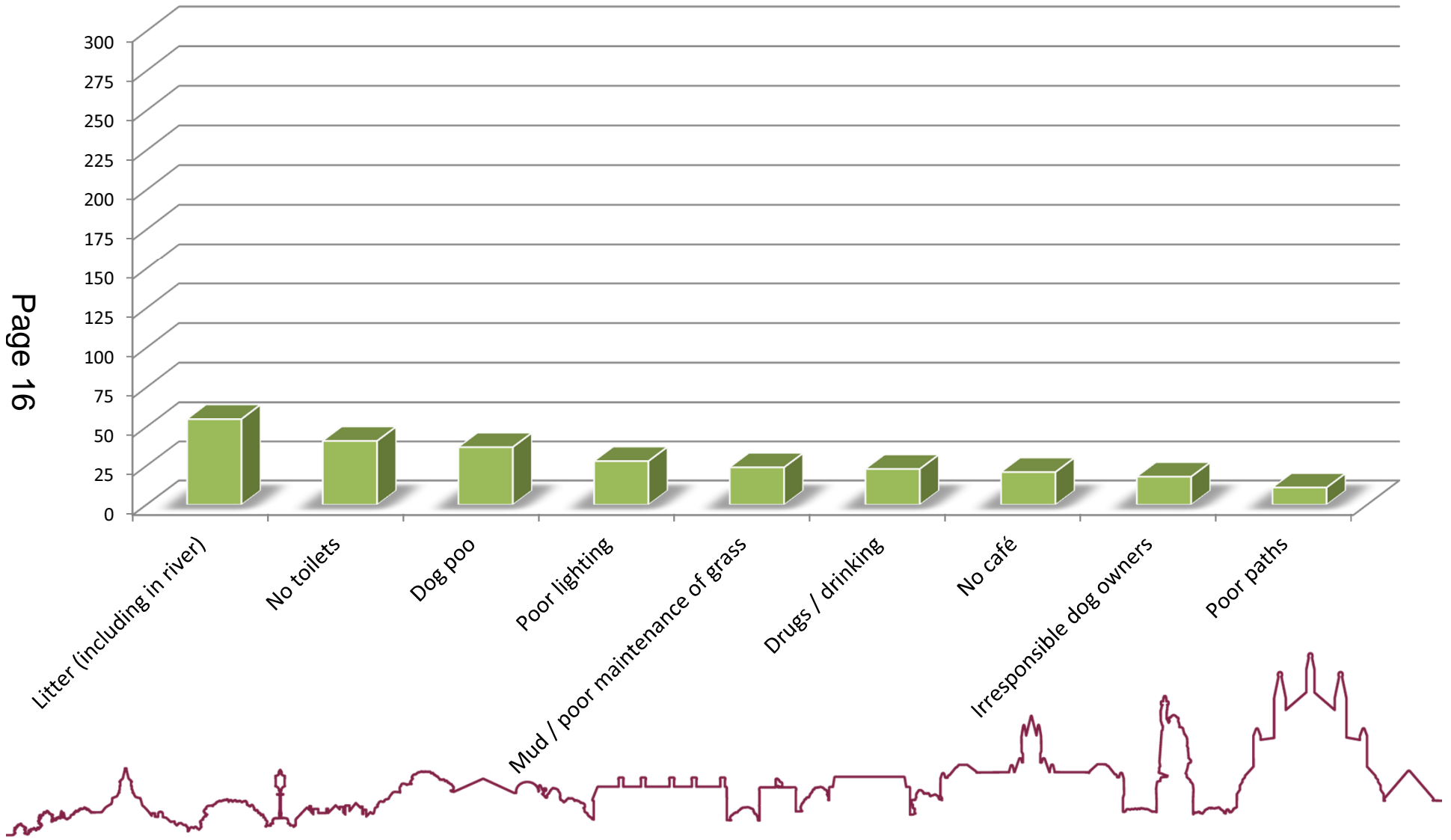

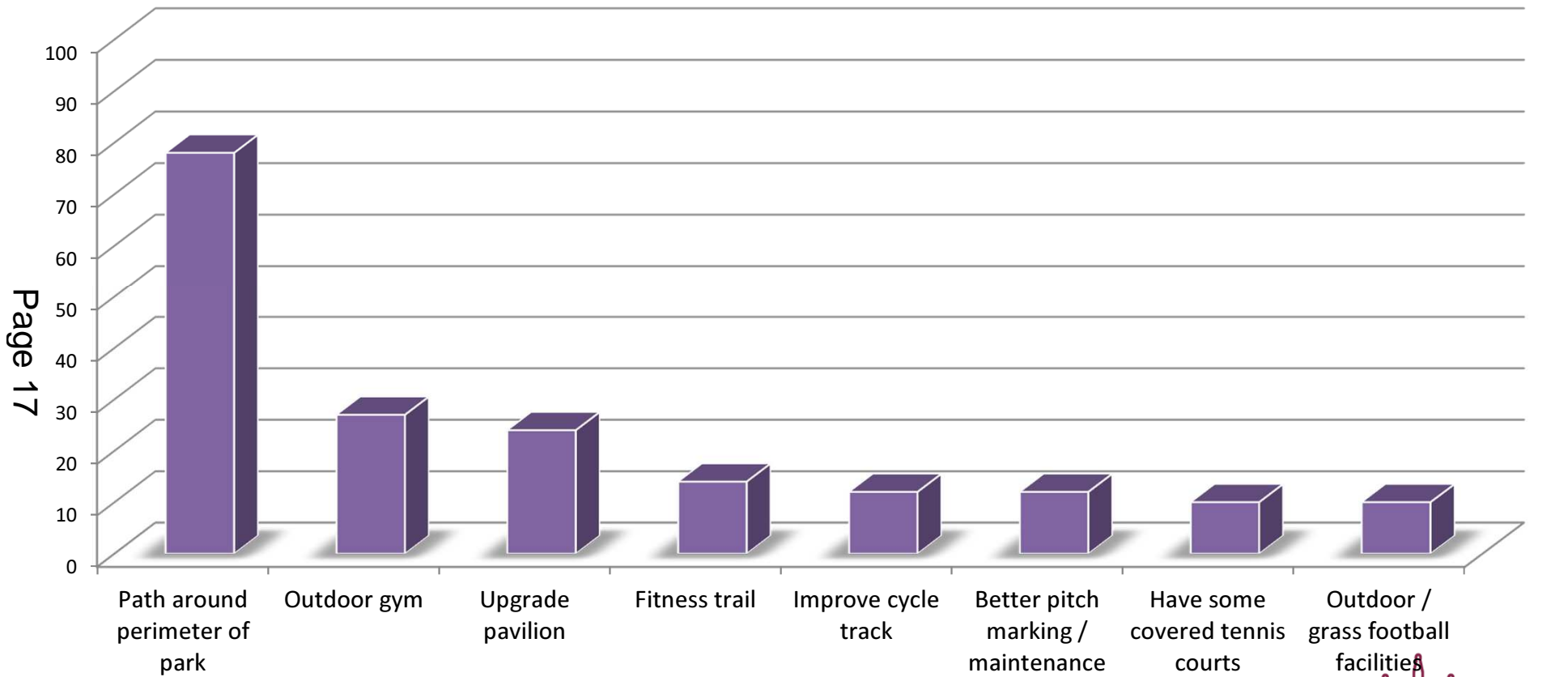

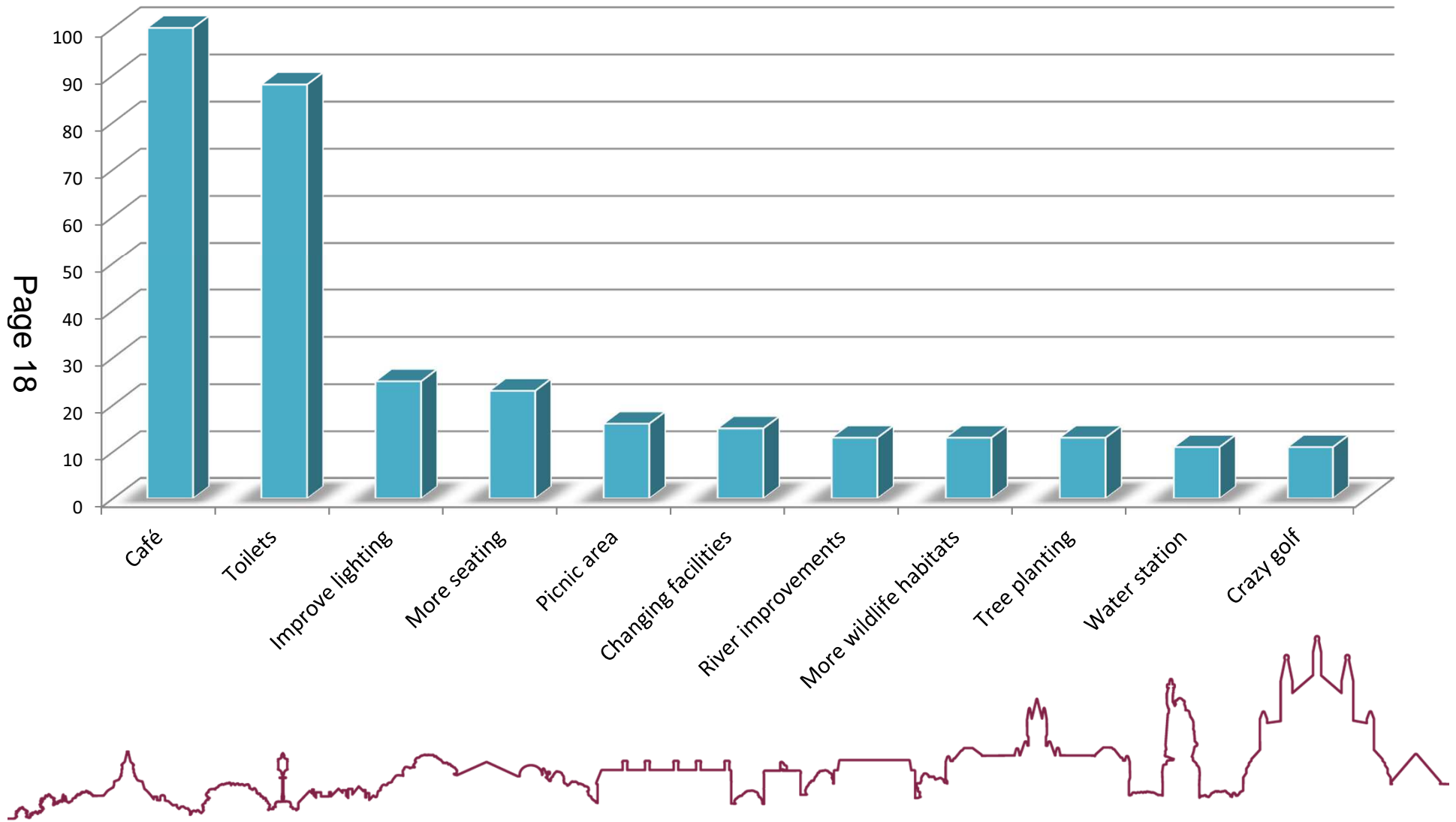

RESULTS – SUGGESTED IMPROVEMENTS TO SPORTS FACILITIES.

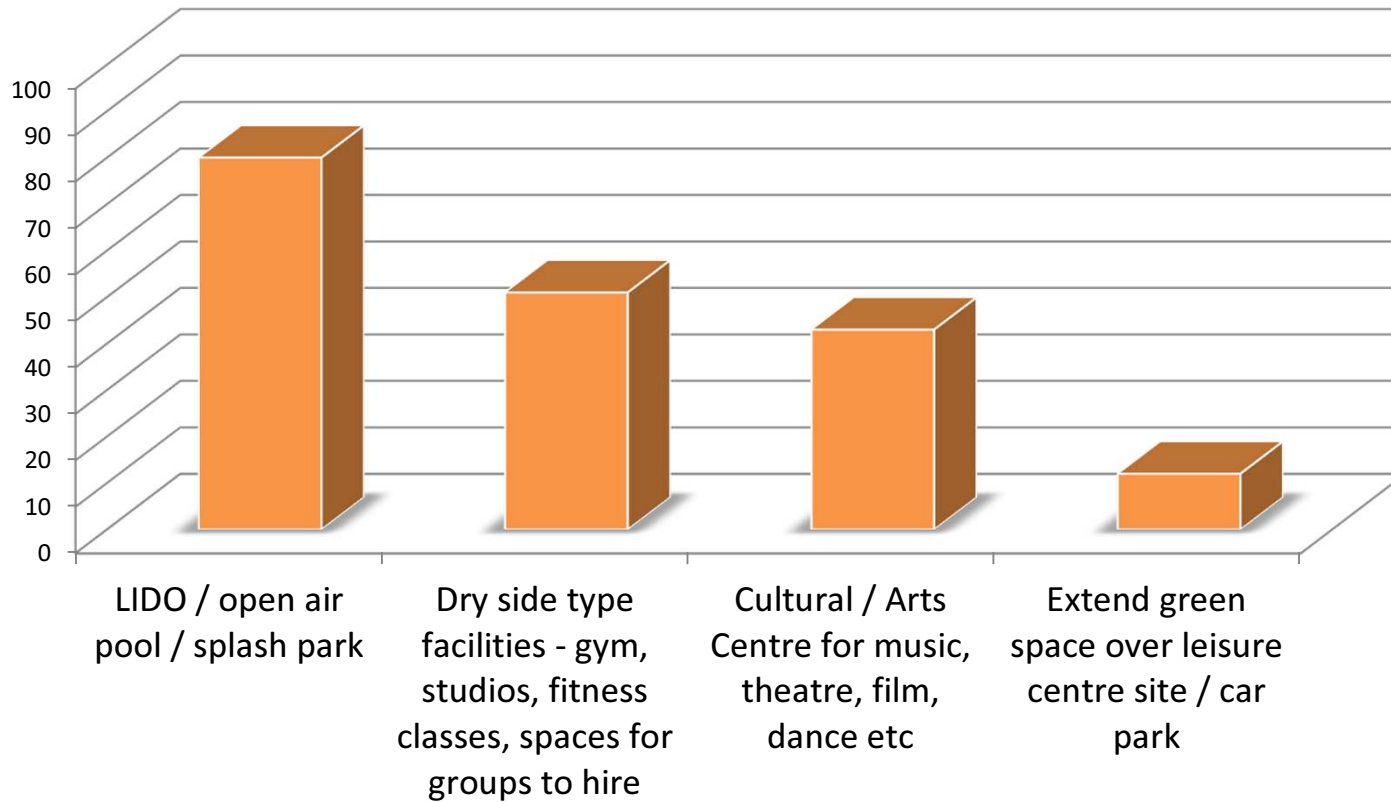

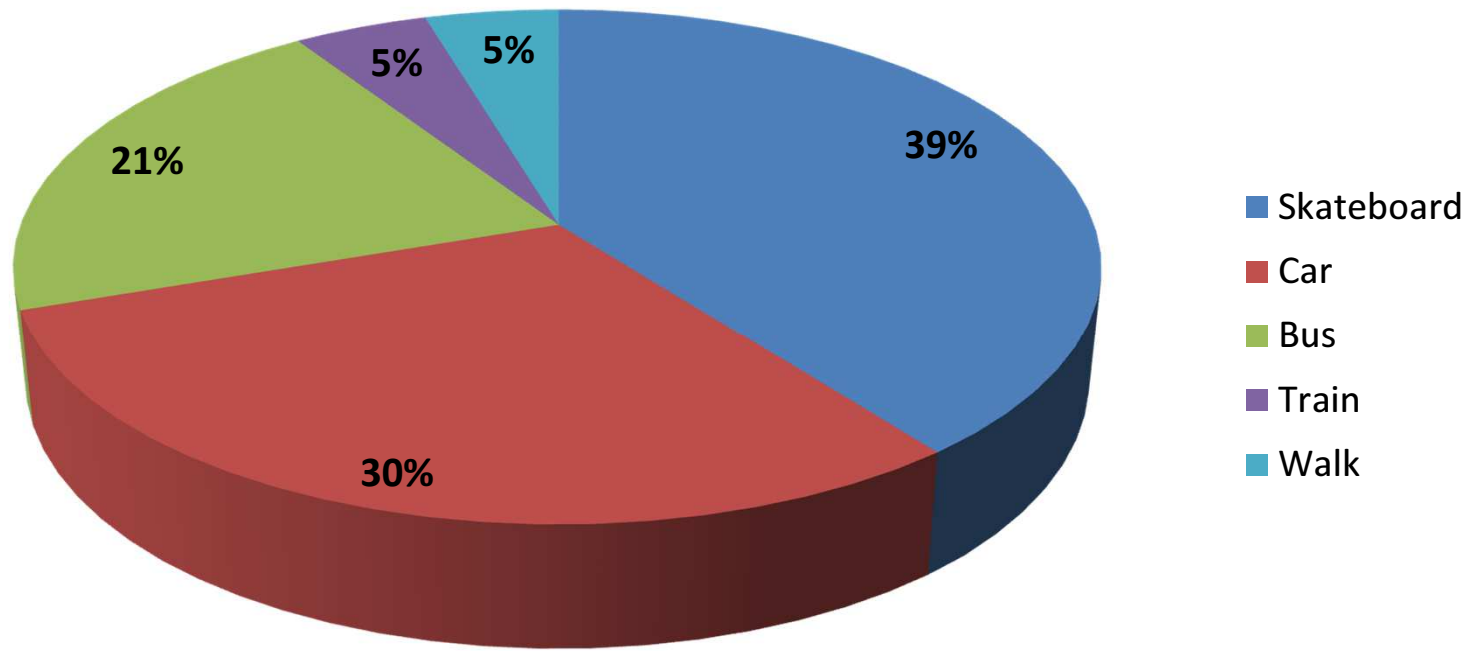


RESULTS – NORTH WALLS SKATE PARK

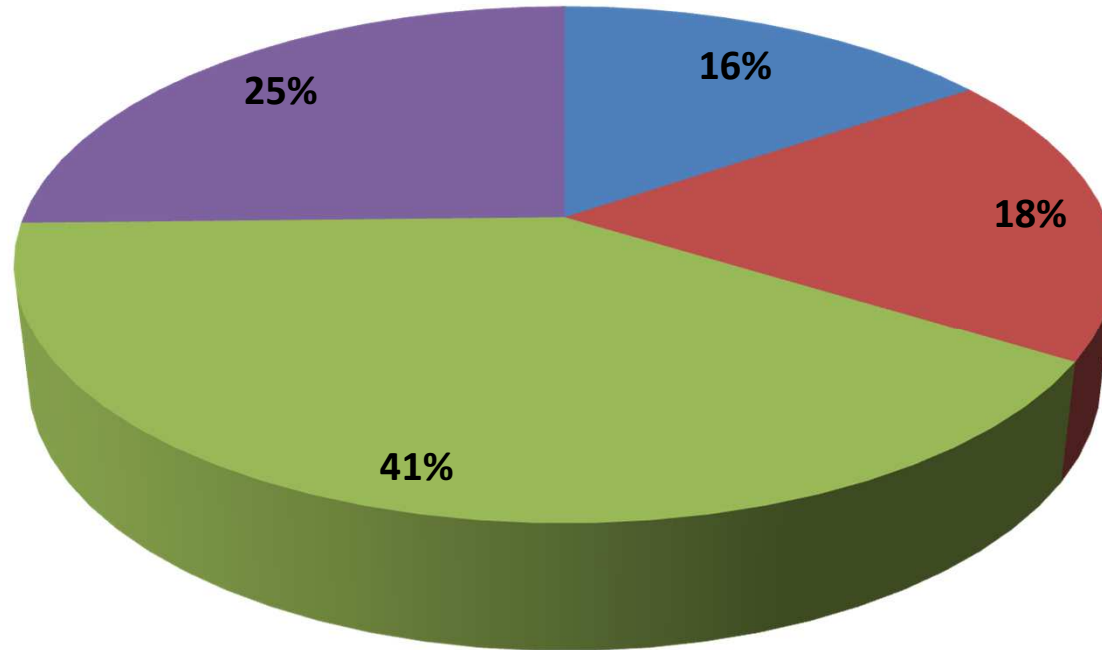
- 🏰 The skate park attracts a wider audience and the visit profile is different to the rest of the recreation ground. For this reason, these results are being shown separately.
- 🏰 Skateboarders come from a wide area including **Eastleigh, Basingstoke, Portsmouth, Bournemouth and the Isle of Wight**. Users of the park generally visit only the skate park and do not use other areas of the recreation ground.
- 🏰 The sample size was much smaller (ie around 30 people) so the significance placed on the results should be adapted accordingly.



RESULTS – HOW DO YOU USUALLY GET TO THE SKATE PARK?



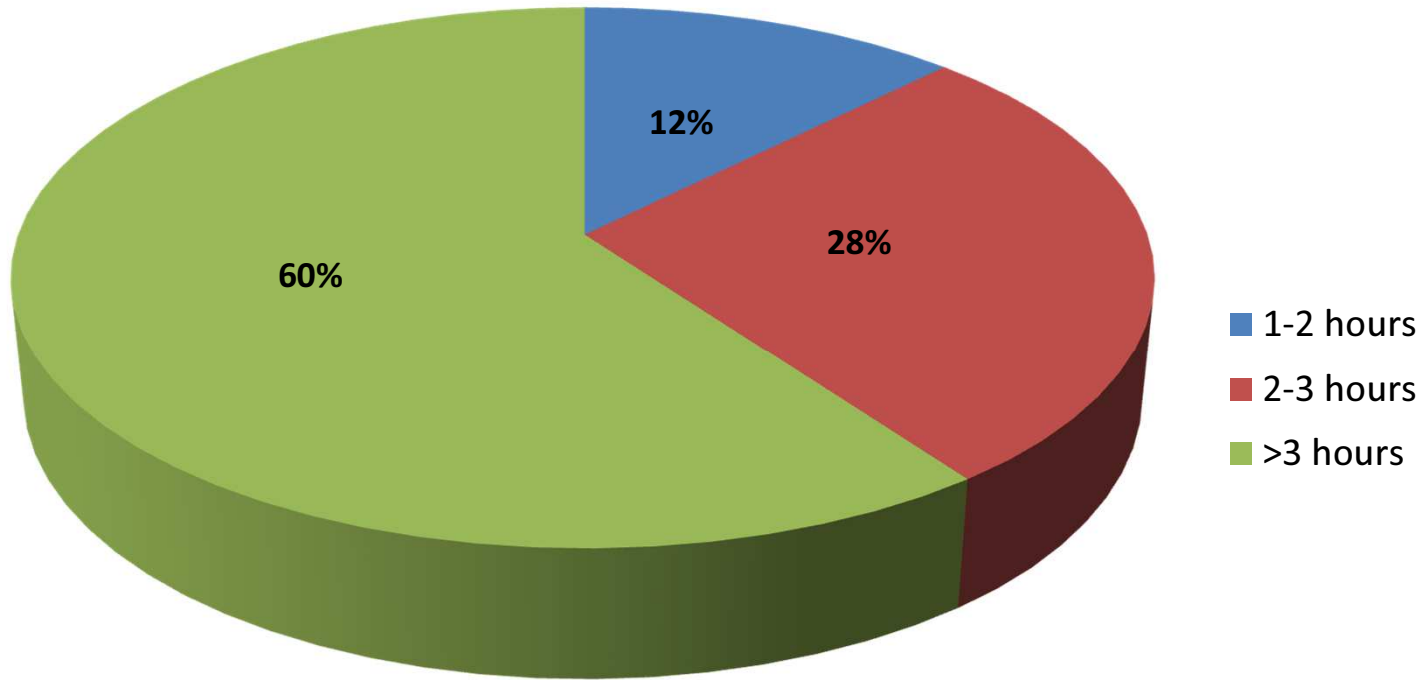
RESULTS – WHAT TIME OF DAY DO YOU VISIT THE SKATE PARK?

SUMMARY OF RESULTS AND NEXT STEPS

-  The site is a vitally important open green space supporting the health and wellbeing of local residents (both mental and physical).
-  The site is primarily a local resource for local people and is generally meeting local need, although some minor improvements were requested.
-  There are opportunities for additional facilities, but first it is necessary to develop a clear vision for the site.
-  This vision will need to include a number of factors such as the relationship with the surrounding area, access points, the cricket pavilion, the need for toilets and a café and the management of existing facilities.
