

A BRIEF HISTORY OF WINCHESTER'S WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES

Pre-2011	Serco had multi function blue collar service contract
₩ 2009/10	County wide discussions about full waste collection partnership – broke down
3010	East Hants and Winchester agreed joint contract and procurement
2011	Biffa appointed – large financial savings
₩ 2018	East Hants to delegate function to Havant Borough Council from October 2019
₩ 2019	Winchester extends Biffa contract for one year
3020	New Winchester contract will start in October



WHAT'S IN THE NEW CONTRACT?

- Alternative Weekly Collection (AWC) of residual and co-mingled dry recyclables same items
- Same arrangements for:
 - **In the Properties of the Properties**
 - Communal Collections
 - Assisted Collections
 - Healthcare waste
- Household glass collection (starting this October)
- Collection of small waste electricals/electronics
- Garden waste collection (free or option to charge)
- Gharged for bulky waste collections
- Bring sites retained but fewer
- No longer returning if householder fails to put bin out



WHAT MIGHT BE DIFFERENT IN THE NEW CONTRACT?

- Frice for the collection of food waste as separate item
 - Householders would have an indoor and outdoor caddy
 - ₩ Weekly collection

 - Expensive but may be affordable
 - Priced from 2020 or 2023 (also in the event of extension)
 - Decision when we see Initial Tenders
- Gharging for garden waste an option



WHAT ARE THE CONTEXTUAL ISSUES?

- The government's national waste strategy may introduce:
 - ₩ a consistent range of materials which must be collected
 - a requirement to collect food waste separately
 - new funding for local authority recycling services
 - 😽 a drinking bottle deposit scheme
- Many of which could have a significant impact on waste collection/disposal services for local authorities
- Hampshire County Council replacement of Alton and Portsmouth recycling facilities with what and when?
- ₩ Public attitudes and expectations more collections, more interest and more concern about end results




WHAT ARE OUR CONCERNS?

- Financial how much will new contract cost?
- What judgements to make in an uncertain climate e.g. food waste collection?
- Decisions of Hampshire County Council as waste disposal authority
 - **We what can we collect?**
 - **We where can we take it?**
 - **We what are the financial mechanisms?**
- How to meet public expectations?
- Figuring the new service starts well and performs consistently to the expected standard
