A5	Revised General Fund Budget 2020/21	 That due to the continuing restrictions on operation of public venues and associated operating costs of the Guildhall , that the Guildhall remain closed to general public hire for the next 12 months but that a "venue only" service be provided. That virtual meetings of the council's committees continue for the remainder of the 2020/21 committee calendar but this be reviewed on a quarterly basis. 	The COVID19 pandemic has had a very significant impact on council finances, with additional costs incurred in providing the necessary and life saving community response to support the most vulnerable residents in our district. However, with the national restrictions on social mobility and enforced closure of businesses there has been a significant reduction in income received by the council due to significant reduction in demand in parking, Guildhall activity and service related fees and charges. The associated reduction in economic activity has also severely impacted the council's property	Report CAB3256 recommends addressing projected deficits through reduced revenue spend and changes to the funding of the capital programme. An alternative option would have been to use uncommitted or unrestricted reserves to cover the deficit. However, such an approach would have taken the level of reserves to below acceptable levels and also reduced the options for addressing potential shortfalls in future years and is not recommended.
