The Pavement Licensing Policy makes specific reference to ensuring that the needs of people with disabilities are considered through the application and determination processes for Pavement Licences.

The legislation requires the City Council to consider the recommended minimum footway widths and distances required for access by mobility impaired and visually impaired people when determining applications. It also references the guidelines set out in the Department for Transport's Inclusive Mobility guidance.

The Secretary of State has also published a national condition which must apply to all Pavement Licences granted or deemed granted, referencing the need to ensure that clear routes of access along the highway are maintained, taking into account the needs of disabled people.
