





Illustrated Conversation





Each participant was brought images to the table that related to 3 key themes: People, Planet, Place. The images were used to spark a discussion and participants were encouraged to write key concepts, ideas or quotes that resonated during the workshop.

B Associating Conversation Output to Sub-Themes



Participants then distributed/classified the key concepts, ideas and quotes (outputs of Step A) into 6 sub-themes that reflect the Footprint dimensions: Place, Wellbeing, Climate, Circular, Community, Nature.

C Conceptual Clusters



In smaller groups, the participants identified conceptual clusters within which the ideas could be segmented into.
