11 SUPPORTING INFORMATION:

Introduction

- 11.1 The City Council as the Licensing Authority is required to review and publish its Licensing Policy under section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 every five years.
- 11.2 During the five year period, the Licensing Authority must keep its policy under review and make such revisions to it, as such times, as it considers appropriate.
- 11.3 The current Licensing Policy was adopted by full Council on 13 April 2016 following a review to include consideration of the purposes and duties of the South Downs National Park.

Review of Licensing Policy

- 11.4 Officers reviewed the Licensing Policy and made minor amendments to bring the document up to date.
- 11.5 Consideration was given to all comments received; the majority of which were included in the revised Policy presented to the Licensing and Regulation Committee on 21 February 2019. Report LR517 refers.
- 11.6 At the Licensing and Regulation Committee on 21 February 2019, Members resolved to approve the revised Policy, with minor typographically errors corrected, to be recommended to Council for adoption.
- 11.7 The reviewed Licensing Policy can be found at Appendix 1 of the report.
- 12 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED
- 12.1 The South Downs National Park Authority suggested the addition of a specific reference to the International Dark Sky Reserve under the public nuisance

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- section. This was not included as this is referenced in the SDNPA guidance which has been included in paragraph 1.6 of the Policy.
- 12.2 Cheriton Parish Council suggested a change of wording in relation to noise controls. This was not agreed following the suggested changes by Environmental Health to remove this paragraph.
- 12.3 Cllr Hugh Lumby, Member for Upper Meon Valley Ward, proposed a change in relation to noise controls. This was not agreed following suggested changes by Environmental Health to remove this paragraph. After the circulation of report LR517 and revised Policy, which included the proposed changes by Environmental Health, Cllr Lumby confirmed that he was satisfied with the changes.
